- 1. **Decision on taking business in private:** The Committee agreed to take item 8 in private.
- Subordinate legislation: The Committee took evidence on the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014 (Part 4 and Part 5 Complaints) Revocation Order 2016 [draft] from—

3. **Subordinate legislation:** John Swinney (Cabinet Secretary for Education and Skills) moved—

- 7. Review of Evidence (in private): The Committee agreed to highlight the evidence heard relating to child poverty to the Scottish Government as part of its consultation on the Child Poverty Bill. The Committee also agreed to write to the Cabinet Secretary seeking: clarification as to when the criteria that the Government will use to measure the attainment gap will be available; and, having set these criteria, an indication as to how long a period would need to elapse before the Committee could usefully start assessing the Government's progress towards closing the attainment gap.
