Foreword

This is the 7th Annual Report on the Scottish Parliament's Lobbying Register and the final report before the next Scottish Parliament election in May 2026.

Last year's report highlighted the ongoing work of the Lobbying Register team to contact every registered organisation (over 1,300) by the end of 2024. This was to provide each organisation with a statement on all its regulated lobbying activities to date, provide details on past compliance performance and set out clearly the statutory deadlines, and to resolve any outstanding issues it may have had.

This effort has led to a significant improvement in the levels of compliance overall. The team are now working closely with organisations to ensure that level is maintained, and with a sustained push to reduce the number of future breaches.

Whilst significant progress has been made, I would repeat my request of last year for organisations with compliance issues to reach out quickly to ensure issues can be managed efficiently – the team will be ready to assist.

I am very pleased to note the excellent progress on our project to redevelop the current Lobbying Register system. This significant investment by the Parliament is on schedule, and we aim to introduce the new system following the election in May 2026. Registered organisations and the public were consulted in February this year through our online surveys. The feedback provided has been a great help to inform how to modernise the system functionality, improve the overall user journey and better present the key transparency information the Register provides.

The team will be providing updates and further engaging during the project's development phase, so please look out for information throughout the coming year.

As always, my thanks for your time in reading this report.

Facal-tòiseachaidh

Seo an 7mh Aithisg Bhliadhnail air Clàrcoiteachaidh Pàrlamaid na h-Alba agus an aithisg mu dheireadh ron ath thaghadh aig Pàrlamaid na h-Alba sa Chèitean 2026.

Nochd an aithisg againn an-uiridh obair leantainneach sgioba a' Chlàr-choiteachaidh gus fios a chur gu gach buidheann clàraichte (còrr is 1,300) ro dheireadh 2024. Bha seo gus aithris a thoirt dhaibh air a' choiteachadh riaghlaichte a rinn iad gu ruige sin, fiosrachadh a thoirt seachad mun choileanadh gèillidh aca roimhe is na cinn-latha reachdail innse gu soilleir, agus fuasgladh a lorg air duilgheadasan sam bith a dh'fhaodadh a bhith aca.

Mar thoradh air an oidhirp seo, thàinig piseach mòr air ìrean gèillidh san fharsaingeachd. Tha an sgioba a-nis ag obair gu dlùth le buidhnean airson dèanamh cinnteach gu bheil an ìre sin air a cumail suas, agus tha iad a' dèanamh oidhirp leantainneach gus an àireamh de bhrisidhean san àm ri teachd

a lùghdachadh. Ged a rinneadh adhartas mòr, bu mhath leam iarraidh, mar a rinn mi an-uiridh, gun cuireadh buidhnean le cùisean gèillidh fios thugainn gu sgiobalta gus an urrainn dhuinn trioblaidean fhuasgladh gu h-èifeachdach – tha an sgioba deiseil agus deònach ur cuideachadh.

Tha mi glè thoilichte innse gun do rinneadh fìor dheagh adhartas sa phròiseact againn airson siostam a' Chlàr-choiteachaidh athleasachadh. Tha an tasgadh susbainteach seo a rinn a' Phàrlamaid a' dol air adhart a rèir a' chlàr-ama, agus tha sinn an dùil an siostam ùr a thoirt a-steach às dèidh an taghaidh sa Chèitean 2026. Chaidh co-chomhairle a chumail ri buidhnean clàraichte agus ris a' phoball sa Ghearran am-bliadhna tro na suirbhidhean air-loidhne againn. Bha am fios-air-ais a fhuair sinn air leth feumail ann a bhith a' moladh mar a dh'fhaodadh an siostam ùr obrachadh, eòlas iomlan an neach-cleachdaidh a leasachadh, agus am prìomh

fhiosrachadh follaiseachd a tha an Clàr a' toirt seachad a thaisbeanadh ann an dòigh nas fheàrr.

Bidh an sgioba ag innse na naidheachd as ùire agus a' dèanamh barrachd conaltraidh rè ìre leasachaidh a' phròiseict – cùm sùil a-mach airson fiosrachadh tron bhliadhna a tha romhainn.

Mar as àbhaist, mo thaing airson ùine a ghabhail a' leughadh na h-aithisg seo.

Updates

Parliamentary review

The Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee is to consider the implementation of the Lobbying (Scotland) Act 2016 and any further changes to the legislation, when able to do so, prior to, or after, the Scottish Parliamentary election in 2026.

New Lobbying Register

As mentioned in the Chief Executive foreword, work is well underway to implement a new lobbying register system. The target date for implementation is May 2026.

Surveys were conducted during February this year by the Parliament's researchers, SPICe, canvassing views on improved functionality from registered organisations and the public. The ideas generated were a great help in developing a specification which was used in the full procurement process that followed. That process has now been completed, and the contract to develop the new system was awarded to Fortesium Ltd. in September.

As a significant long-term investment by the Parliament, the project team aims to work with users to deliver a more modern and intuitive system, future-proofed for the years ahead.

Sessions to carry out testing during the development phase will take place later in the year. We will seek volunteer organisations to assist, so please look out for our team getting in touch. Next year, we will also set up sessions about the new system to help all users before going live in May 2026.

The Register launched on 12 March 2018. This report covers data from that start date up until 11 June 2025.


Registrants by number

Registrants by year




Each registrant must submit an Information Return for every instance of regulated lobbying. These are known as substantive returns. If a registrant has not engaged over its statutory six-month reporting period, then a nil return must be submitted, instead.

Information returns by number

As of 11 June 2025, a total of 46,071 returns were published. A total of 36,278 were substantive returns and 9,793 nil returns had been published on the Lobbying Register.



Compliance

Information returns cycle - Key dates



As the diagram sets out, each registered organisation must submit returns by its statutory date for each six-month period.

A failure to submit returns, or a nil return instead, by any period deadline results in an automatic breach of the Act. This is notified to the organisation by an email from the Lobbying Register Team. Those organisations issued breaches in each reporting year are listed below, in this report. As such, it is essential that an organisation operates in an organised and timely manner.

Past annual reports have emphasised the need to reduce the number of breaches that we see each year. We have seen a reduction in this reporting year from 682 to 609, a figure which remains too high, with over a third of all active organisations still breaching at least once a year.







In most cases, breaches are rectified within a reasonable timescale, but not always. As set out in the Clerk/Chief Executive's foreword to this report, organisations with compliance issues should get in touch quickly to ensure issues can be managed efficiently.

Analysis shows us that many breaches are easily avoidable, resulting from the following types of situations:

- an organisation not sufficiently planning for its six-monthly deadline (deadlines are clearly shown on each organisation's dashboard).
- an organisation not checking its registered email box regularly (where it would pick up the email reminder issued by the Lobbying Register Team a month before each deadline).

- an organisation not having sufficient cover for an individual who leads on the submission and resubmission of information returns, especially when they become unexpectedly absent.
- a similar individual moving on from the organisation without arranging for a replacement or providing a sufficient handover

To help reduce such situations and the continuing high number of breaches, we are looking at new functionality in the replacement Lobbying Register to be introduced next year.

This new functionality would allow an organisation to manage its own account in a way in which it can add additional back-up users and manage how those users can also receive alerts for statutory deadlines, as well as other communications made by the Lobbying Register Team.

By providing and encouraging the use of this type of functionality in the new system, we hope this will lead to a much bigger reduction of breaches issued in future years.
