Previous minutes

Matters arising

2. There were no matters arising.

Future business programme

- 3. The Bureau agreed to recommend to the Parliament a revised programme of business for the week commencing 13 January 2020 and a programme of business for the weeks commencing 20 and 27 January 2020.

Timetabling of a Bill at Stage 2

6. The Bureau agreed to refer the Female Genital Mutilation (Protection and Guidance) (Scotland) Bill back to the Equalities and Human Rights Committee for consideration at Stage 2 and to recommend to the Parliament that consideration of the Bill at that stage be completed by Friday 31 January 2020.

Approval of an SSI

- The Bureau agreed to recommend to the Parliament that the Criminal Justice (Scotland) Act 2016 (Support for Vulnerable Persons) Regulations 2019 [draft] be agreed.

Finance and Constitution Committee: Request to travel
