Meeting of the Parliament

Tuesday 3 March 2026

The meeting opened at 2.00 pm.

1. Time for Reflection: Representative Tsering Yangkey, led Time for Reflection.

5. Contract (Formation and Remedies) (Scotland) Bill: The Minister for Victims and Community Safety (Siobhian Brown) moved S6M-20943—That the Parliament agrees that the Contract (Formation and Remedies) (Scotland) Bill be passed.

The motion was agreed to ((DT) by division: For 106, Against 0, Abstentions 0).

6. European Charter of Local Self-Government (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill – Reconsideration Stage: The Bill was considered at Reconsideration Stage.

7. European Charter of Local Self-Government (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill: Mark Ruskell moved S6M-20934—That the Parliament agrees that the European Charter of Local Self-Government (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill be approved.

The motion was agreed to ((DT) by division: For 108, Against 0, Abstentions 0).

8. Suspension of Standing Orders: The Minister for Parliamentary Business and Veterans (Graeme Dey), on behalf of the Parliamentary Bureau, moved S6M-20966—That the Parliament agrees that, for the purposes of consideration of the Visitor Levy (Amendment) (Scotland) Bill, Rule 9.5.3A of Standing Orders is suspended.

The motion was agreed to (DT).

9. Committee Meeting Times: The Minister for Parliamentary Business and Veterans (Graeme Dey), on behalf of the Parliamentary Bureau, moved S6M-20967—That the Parliament agrees that, under Rule 12.3.3B of Standing Orders, the Local Government, Housing and Planning Committee can meet, if necessary, at the same time as a meeting of the Parliament after Portfolio Questions and before Decision Time and during Members' Business on Wednesday 4 March 2026.

10. Substitution on Committees: The Minister for Parliamentary Business and Veterans (Graeme Dey), on behalf of the Parliamentary Bureau, moved S6M-20968—That the Parliament agrees that Stephen Kerr be appointed as the Scottish Conservative and Unionist Party substitute on the Local Government, Housing and Planning Committee.

The motion was agreed to (DT).

11. Motion Without Notice: The Minister for Parliamentary Business and Veterans (Graeme Dey), on behalf of the Parliamentary Bureau, moved a motion without notice that, under Rule 11.2.4, Decision Time be brought forward to 5.01 pm.

The motion was agreed to.

12. Decision Time: The Parliament took decisions on items 5, 7, 8, 9, and 10 as noted above.

13. Recognising the Pressures Facing A&E Departments: The Parliament debated S6M-20795 in the name of Jackie Baillie—That the Parliament recognises the reported pressures facing A&E departments; is concerned that recorded waiting times are persistently high, with the number of people waiting more than 8 hours and 12 hours reported in 2025 as 171,854 and 74,052 respectively; notes the consequent rise in corridor care adversely affecting people in the Dumbarton constituency and across Scotland; considers that using the metric of acute hospital bed occupancy as well as A&E waiting times can help to relieve these pressures, and notes calls on the Scottish Government to ensure that reductions in occupancy act as the mechanism by which the whole system is held to account.
