## PE2087/J: Pass a law making exercising a dog in a cemetery an offence

## West Dunbartonshire Council written submission, 1 May 2025

I refer to your email of 4 April 2025 requesting information on behalf of the Citizen Participation and Public Petitions Committee regarding the presence and behaviour of dogs in cemeteries.

I can advise as follows:

 Existing Policies: The following rules are extracted from the West Dunbartonshire Council ("the Council") Rules and Regulations for the management of cemeteries:

## **Dogs to be Under Control**

- a) A person shall not allow any dog belonging to them or in their charge to enter or remain in any cemetery unless such dog is led by a leash and kept under proper and effective control. No person shall allow any dog belonging to them to foul any part of the cemetery.
- b) The Director or their representative is authorised to remove from the cemetery any person who contravenes the provision of this regulation.
- **Complaints:** On average, we receive 15 complaints per year regarding the behaviour of dogs in cemeteries.
- **Fines/Invoices:** To date, there have been no fines or invoices issued by the Council for dog fouling in cemeteries.
- **Signage:** Signage exists advising that dogs should be kept on a lead in our cemeteries.
