I am writing on behalf of the Minister for Business to inform the Committee that the refreshed National Events Strategy for Scotland 2024-2035 has been published today.

The publication marks the conclusion of the National Events Strategy Review and delivers on the Scottish Government commitment in the Programme for Government 2023/24.

Developing "Scotland's National Events Strategy 2024 – 2035" has been a collaborative effort, shaped by voices from across the event sector, Trade Unions, Local Authorities and the wider public sector.

Following a rigorous consultation and engagement process, clear agreed priorities have emerged to shape a strategy that provides focus for the whole events sector, bringing everyone together to deliver a shared ambition.

This strategy can sustain and develop a dynamic, resilient, and responsible events sector – from regular local community events to one-off international business, cultural and sporting events – that is a valued part of Scotland's wellbeing economy, maintaining Scotland's reputation as the perfect stage for events.
