The **Scottish Parliament** makes **laws** in Scotland.



**Laws** are rules that tell people what they can or cannot do.



The Scottish Parliament talks about things that matter to the people of Scotland.

We are starting an **inquiry** to find out about **additional support for learning** in Scotland.

An **inquiry** is when we find out information about something.



Additional support for learning is support that is different from the support children would usually get in nurseries, pre-schools and schools.





We want people who have **experience** of additional support for learning in schools to tell us what it was like.


**Experience** means something that has happened in your life or that you have been a part of.

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
We have written some questions for you to answer. This is called a **survey**.

**Barriers** are things that get in the way and make something harder to do.










