National Performance Framework (NPF): Parliamentary scrutiny of proposed national outcomes

Thank you for your [letter on 6 March 2024](#) and [your letter on 3 May 2024](#) outlining your Committee's approach to parliamentary scrutiny of the NPF proposed national outcomes. It was also helpful to see the [72 responses to your call for views](#) and the [SPICe summary of the responses](#).

The Committee considered its approach to scrutiny of the NPF proposed national outcomes at its Business Planning Day on 11 September 2024 and agreed to mainstream its scrutiny throughout its future inquiries including its forthcoming scrutiny of the Education (Scotland) Bill and the Schools (Residential Outdoor Education) (Scotland) Bill which will look at some of the issues raised by respondents to your call for views.
