Dear Convener,

I write to inform you that, as per Section 99 of the Redress for Survivors (Historical Child Abuse in Care) (Scotland) Act 2021, which states:

'Before the end of the period of 2 months beginning with the last day of each reporting period, a relevant person must prepare and send to the Scottish Ministers a report on the actions which the person has taken during the reporting period to redress the historical abuse of children (a "redress report")'.

Section 99 also states:

'The Scottish Ministers must—

- a) collate the information from the redress reports sent to them under subsection (1) into a combined report for the year to which the reports relate, and*
- b) publish the combined report.'*

We have published the 2024 Annual Combined Report on 28 August, which sets out the actions taken by contributors to Scotland's Redress Scheme to redress the historical abuse of children.
