UNIVERSAL PERIODIC REVIEW – SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT RESPONSE TO RECOMMENDATIONS

I am writing to advise the Committee that the Scottish Government has published a formal response to recommendations issued by the UN Human Rights Council (UNHRC) following its last Universal Periodic Review (UPR)¹ of the UK's overall human rights record.

Our response to the recommendations follows on from the Scottish Government's position statement published in October 2022² in advance of the Interactive Dialogue held in Geneva in November 2022. Both that position statement and our detailed response to the UNHRC's recommendations are now available on the Scottish Government's website. UK participation in the UPR process provides an opportunity for the Scottish Government to publicly account for the measures we have taken, in Scotland, to give effect to international human rights obligations. Our response to the UNHRC recommendations adopts a thematic approach which explains the progress that has been made since October 2022 and the next steps we need to take in order to implement the latest UPR recommendations.

The next key milestone in the current UPR cycle will be a mid-term report in 2025, with the conclusion of the current (fourth) cycle and commencement of the fifth cycle expected to be in 2026 or 2027.
