## NON-IMPLEMENTATION OF LEGISLATION

Officials have created the first draft statutory guidance in preparation for its review by our working group and specialist organisations. Officials have continued to engage with the Addressing Violence **Against Minority Ethnic** Women and Girls. Within the most recent meeting, in September, an agenda item and discussion was focused on effective communication with communities in terms of awareness raising of FGM. Awareness raising work will be shaped by the guidance and court rules, and as such, the main release of the awareness raising materials will likely take place on completion of implementation.
