Dear Kenneth

I wrote to you on 22 August to inform you that I had agreed with the Chief Secretary to the Treasury (CST) that preliminary work would begin to establish the scope for the next review of the Fiscal Framework. I have been clear with the CST that the Scottish Government's position is that the scope of the next review should be broader than the last.

When I met with the CST in a meeting of the Joint Exchequer Committee in October, I highlighted the particular interest of the Scottish Parliament and its committees in the next review of the Fiscal Framework and the importance of stakeholder engagement.

I would like to invite the Committee to share its views on the key areas that should be prioritised in the next review, and therefore included within its scope. In particular, I would be keen to hear the Committee's thoughts on:

- the potential for the review to consider devolution of new powers to Scotland;
- where additional or increased flexibilities should be sought to better mitigate against the risks facing the Scottish Budget, and;
- other areas in which you think the current arrangements could be improved.

I am also writing to the Convener of the Social Justice and Social Security Committee with a similar request.

I am keen to make as much progress as possible towards reaching an agreement on scope in advance of the dissolution of Parliament. Therefore, I would welcome views in written form prior to the Christmas recess and would be happy to follow up on any issues raised in the new year.
