### Level 7 Diploma in Aesthetic Practice (Qualifi)

- **Scope and Purpose**: Designed to prepare practitioners for independent, safe, and effective practice in non-surgical aesthetics. It focuses on advanced clinical knowledge, critical thinking, and evidence-based decision-making.
- **Structure**: The qualification typically carries **120 credits** (equivalent to a Master's level PGDip) and is mapped to the **RQF** (**Regulated Qualifications Framework**) at Level 7.

## **Level 6 Diploma in Aesthetic Practice**

 Scope: Provides advanced skills beyond entry-level, preparing practitioners to transition into injectables and more complex procedures.

### • Learning Outcomes:

- In-depth understanding of skin science and ageing.
- Safe delivery of a defined range of aesthetic procedures.
- Enhanced consultation and clinical assessment skills.
- Assessment: Competency-based, including both theory and supervised practical work.

# **Level 5 Diploma in Aesthetic Practice**

• Scope: Entry-level qualification forming the foundation for safe clinical aesthetics practice.

### • Focus Areas:

- o Professional standards and legal frameworks.
- Anatomy and physiology relevant to aesthetics.
- o Basic non-invasive aesthetic procedures (e.g. chemical peels, microneedling, skin rejuvenation).
- Assessment: Practical demonstrations, written assignments, and clinical observations.

• Level 5 provides foundations (anatomy, legal/ethical frameworks, infection control, skin treatments) aligning with HEE's entry-level safety requirements and NOS units such as **SKANSF1** (maintain

- infection prevention and control in aesthetics).
- Level 6 builds on this with advanced skin science, enhanced consultation, and supervised practical treatments consistent with HEE's staged progression model (foundation → supervised practice → independent competence).
