Inquiry into Community Planning

The Local Government, Housing and Planning Committee is conducting postlegislative scrutiny of Part 2 of the Community Empowerment Act 2015, which creates requirements for community planning in each local authority area.

The Committee's <u>inquiry</u> is looking in particular at the impact of the Act on community planning, and how Community Planning Partnerships (CPPs) respond to significant events such as the Covid-19 pandemic and the current cost of living crisis.

Regional transport authorities are listed as statutory partners in community planning, and to help inform our inquiry I would be grateful to receive your insights into the following:

- 1. How Nestrans engages with the CPP and works in partnership with other members.
- 2. Whether there are any challenges or barriers to that engagement being effective.
- 3. Your views on the whether the Act is meeting its objective of reducing inequalities, and the effectiveness of Local Outcome Improvement Plans and locality plans.
- 4. Whether the statutory partners as set out in Schedule 1 of the Act needs revisiting.

5. Whether there is sufficient leadership at a local or national level to support community planning.

I would be grateful for a response by the 31st March to enable the Committee to consider your contribution in the inquiry evidence.
