Auditor General for Scotland's draft work programme

Thank you for your letter of 12 May, seeking feedback on the AGS' draft work programme.

The Scottish Housing Regulator is accountable to the Scottish Parliament, and each year it appears before the Local Government, Housing and Planning Committee to discuss its annual report and performance.

Due to the Committee receiving a number of representations from stakeholders and MSPs, during our last round of scrutiny we held a more in-depth inquiry which included a written call for views and oral evidence sessions with a number of stakeholders in the housing sector. As a result of that inquiry the Committee has a number of concerns about the culture within the SHR which has affected its performance and its relations with housing providers. We have written to both the SHR and the Scottish Government with our conclusions, and I attach a copy of our letter to the SHR for information.

The Committee has considered how scrutiny of the SHR might in future be made more robust and discussed whether the Auditor General might have a role. Audit Scotland audits the SHR's annual accounts. The Committee wishes to bring to the
