Further to my appearance before the Local Government Housing and Planning Committee on 19 November 2024 where I provided evidence in connection to the Short-Term Let Licensing Implementation Update Report 2024, I am writing to you to provide the following update about our review of guidance.

I am pleased to advise that the Short-Term Let Regulation Guidance Update Group, chaired by VisitScotland, held initial discussions in December and a first meeting with some members on 13 December. A further meeting was held on14 January 2025 to agree the Group's term of reference and consider a long list of issues that may be addressed. The terms or reference outline the structure and membership of the group, the guidance we are welcoming suggested updates on, the scope of the update and the phases of the project (Exploring areas for update, discussing the updates to recommend and drafting).

I am grateful to have expertise present from a balance of perspectives from across industry and local authority expertise with representation from Scottish Tourism Alliance, Scottish Bed and Breakfast Association, Association of Scottish Self Caterers, Short-Term Accommodation Association, SOLAR, licensing authorities, planning authorities and ALACHO.
