In our previously submitted paper, data was provided to show scheduled sailings, those which did not take place, and reasons for cancellation. The Committee also requested data on the reasons for cancellations broken down by route. During the Committee session held 21st February 2023 at the Scottish Parliament in Edinburgh, clarity was sought around how some of our cancellation categories were defined.

Details of scheduled sailings which did not take place can be found in Table 5. Reason for cancellations broken down by route can also be found in Appendix 1.

Whilst there have been growths in cancellations in recent years under the categories of "Force Majeure" and "Scot Government Approved", this has been in a bid to protect island communities and maintain lifeline connections across the network. Further details on these categories and the rationale behind these cancellations can be found below.

Force Majeure

This is provision within the contract where sailings can be cancelled for unexpected, substantial events. The cancellations noted against this heading were directly related to the Covid pandemic. These cancellations were due to either planned cancellations to service to minimise travel to the island communities in compliance with Scottish Government covid guidance around essential travel, or due to lack of crew/staff due to covid outbreaks. These cancellations were all undertaken in a bid to protect the remote island communities from the widespread impacts of covid and minimise transmission across the country. Exceptions are measured against the timetable published and agreed with Transport Scotland. During peak covid we were running essential only timetables and the lower number of sailings would not appear as force majeure.

Scottish Government Approved

These are sailings which were cancelled to allow a vessel to be cascaded to another route to maintain lifeline connectivity, usually in response to technical breakdowns. Under the terms of the contract, where a technical or operational issue arises which results in a vessel being removed from service, CalMac are permitted to cascade a vessel(s)from an alternative route(s) in order to maintain lifeline connectivity across the network. This decision is made with approval from Scottish Government through an agreed protocol. This protocol recognises that cascading vessel(s), even if this means cancelling services to another island, is the right decision to maintain lifeline connectivity for the network as a whole. These cancellations usually affect routes with two vessels or those where there are other ways to get on/off the island (either using other CalMac routes, or via mainland connections).

Due to a lack of relief vessels within the network and the increased demand in scheduled services, all vessels are now fully deployed across the year with no spare capacity to provide relief. Until such times as a relief vessel is available, CalMac will always need to rely on cascading vessels to maintain lifeline services. However, whilst this can result in higher cancellations, this maintains lifeline services as a whole rather than prioritising one island's needs over another.
