9 MSPs and 7 non-MSPs were in attendance.

**24<sup>th</sup> November 2021:** Topics for discussion included themes for future meetings, an update on the Great British Beach Clean, waste and the circular economy and litter and flytipping.

3 MSPs and 21 non-MSPs were in attendance.

**23<sup>rd</sup> February 2022:** The topic for the meeting was food systems with policy context provided by the Good Food Nation Bill, the Circular Economy Bill and the Agriculture Bill. Presentations and discussion touched on issues, such as food production, food waste, natural capital, sustainable bioplastics, food redistribution and agriculture support.

4 MSPs and 25 non-MSPs were in attendance.

**11<sup>th</sup> May 2022:** The topic for the meeting was waste management. The Minister for Green Skills, Circular Economy and Biodiversity gave a presentation on waste management and Scottish Government policy followed by a Q&A session. Further presentations covered a range of waste management issues, such as the Circular Economy Bill, Waste Targets Route Map, extended producer responsibility, incineration and local authority waste management.

7 MSPs and 38 non-MSPs were in attendance.

**2<sup>nd</sup> November 2022:** The topic for the meeting was reuse & repair with presentations and discussion including issues, such as clothing and textiles, the role of social enterprises and tool libraries and procurement policy as it relates to the circular economy. This meeting also served as an AGM with the existing office bearers re-elected to their roles and new members adopted. Note: this meeting was originally scheduled for the 14<sup>th</sup> September but was postponed due to the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

3 MSPs and 49 non-MSPs were in attendance.

1<sup>st</sup> **February 2022:** The topic for the meeting was material footprints with presentations and discussion including issues, such as material flow accounts, circular economic policy in Austria, critical minerals and how businesses can support the fight against climate change.

5 MSPs and 33 non-MSPs were in attendance.
