**15<sup>th</sup> September 2021 – Reconstitution of the CPG Improving Scotland's Health** Attendance: 3 MSP's 28 non MSP's

The Cross Party Group on Improving Scotland's Health was reconstituted following a hiatus caused by the COVID19 Pandemic.

#### 15<sup>th</sup> December 2021 – Formal Meeting

Attendance: 5 MSPs; 61 non-MSPs; 3 invited guests Convener: Brian Whittle MSP

The topic discussion for the meeting was industry influence and conflict of interest. We discussed corporate tactics by health-harming industries that can influence health policy and regulation, including activities during COVID, and how communities may respond.

Guest speakers attending the meeting were, Jeff Collin Professor of Global Health Policy at the University of Edinburgh, Mark Petticrew Professor of Public Health Evaluation at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and Hilda Campbell Chief Executive of COPE Scotland. Questions and answers took place following the presentations.

26 new members were approved and the minute of the meetings on 15<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and 24<sup>th</sup> February 2021.

### 20<sup>th</sup> April 2022 – Formal Meeting

Attendance:3MSPs; 54 non-MSPs; 2 invited guests Convener: Emma Harper MSP (unable to attend) Sheila Duffy convened in her absence.

The subject of this meeting was Marketing Matters we explored the opportunities and importance of restricting the marketing of unhealthy commodities as part of non-communicable disease (NCD) prevention. It is an important time to be having these conversations, as there are current live developments in the areas of tobacco and related products, alcohol and unhealthy food and drink.

Guest speakers attending this meeting were Professor Gerard Hastings, Emeritus Professor and founder on the Institute of Social Marketing and Andy Rowell a senior Research Fellow at the University of Bath. Questions and answers took place in the wider group following the presentation.

Sheila Duffy Chief Executive of ASH Scotland provided an update on the consultations on restriction of advertising of vaping products. Alison Douglas Chief Executive of Alcohol Focus Scotland provided the group with an update on the NCD Coalition.

Following one amendment the minute for the previous meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> December 2021 we unanimously approved.
