Detention

- Presentation from Kate Alexander (Scottish Detainee Visitors) on the work of SDV, an overview of the extensive waits people in detention face and importance of communitybased alternatives.
- Chair of All Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) on Detention, Alison Thewliss MP, provided an update on the work of the APPG on detention including a report and consideration of alternatives to detention including Action Foundation pilot.
- Jonathan Ellis (Detention Forum) shared insights on the number of people being detained and the impact of detention, noted importance of community-based pilots in creating a more compassionate system.
- Mhairi Snowden (HRCS) outlined human rights landscape, how detention constitutes a violation and how the UK compares to neighbouring countries.
- Ahmed (FOSS) discussed hotel accommodation as a means of detention and shared insight on the challenges.
- Members discussed the profit that is made from the detention estate, challenges arising in Glasgow and the varying levels of support across local authorities.
