Purpose of The Group and Proposed Discussion Topics
<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The register lists the CPG for Prevention and Healing of ACEs. We are re-formulating the group. It will have the same remit as before – working towards the prevention and healing of ACEs, specifically through raising awareness of latest science and best practice of child development and trauma; providing MSPs with information, evidence and solutions; influencing local and national policy; and persuading Parliament to implement the right preventive policies. The ultimate goal is to work towards a 70% reduction in child maltreatment by the year 2030 – ‘70/30’.2. The group offers solutions for Parliament to achieve its goal of GIRFEC (Getting It Right For Every Child) and for making Scotland the best place for children to grow up in. It also offers solutions for Parliament’s commitment to create a 21st Century drugs policy using a Trauma-informed approach.3. The Children and Young People CPG has a general remit of recognising and discussing the needs and rights of children. We are focused on the awareness of, and implementation of, best practice and scientific solutions to childhood adversity, in order to create long-term change in policies which will improve the lives of Scotland’s children.4. Topics that will be covered in the next 12 months include: How will we achieve 70/30, West Dunbartonshire and 70/30, Prevention, PCPS (a preventive programme), a Trauma-informed approach to drugs, Trauma-informed prisons, Trauma-informed police, alternatives to prison, Trauma-informed lawyers, Looked After Children, civil justice and family courts, the Barnhaus Model, outdoor education for prevention
