5 How Scotland could benefit from new EU legislation on

family leave and work-life balance

Professor Alison Koslowski, (lead editor of the International Review on Leave Policies & Research 2022 which reviews the parenting leave policies across 49 countries (including Scotland)) presented a report on new EU legislation on family leave and work-life balance. The new legislation has improved rights for all parents (mothers and fathers) and other carers. She explained what Scotland would need to change to match our EU neighbours in this policy area.
