## Scottish National Investment Bank Bill – Printing changes after the Bill As Passed (SP Bill 43B) Session 5, 2020

Printing changes will not be made that would alter the legal effect of the Bill. Clerks are responsible for making a judgement in each case as to whether a printing change is appropriate.
