Scottish Parliament firsts

This Fact Sheet records the first occurrences of a wide range of Scottish Parliament events. Examples include first editions of Scottish Parliament publications and the first Scottish Parliament e-Petition. It does not aim to cover every permutation of first events or to be fully comprehensive in scope, and the wording used to describe 'Parliament firsts' may change over time. Where first instances of languages spoken in the Parliament are recorded, these instances may be a few words, or full sentences or speeches.

A 'Parliament first' might occur in Parliament generally, or in the Chamber or in a committee meeting specifically.

This Fact Sheet is arranged by date with the oldest date first and contains hyperlinks to more information where appropriate.

5 October 2006

3 May 2007

First time electronic tablet devices are allowed to be used as an alternative to paper notes for speaking in the Chamber (correspondence between the Presiding Officer and MSPs)

First Chamber sitting on a Tuesday afternoon

4 September 2012

First Topical Questions: first Topical Question asked <u>S4T-00018 by Siobhan</u> McMahon

6 September 2012

First Muslim Minister appointed: <u>Humza Yousaf, Minister for External Affairs and</u> International Development

19 September 2012

First time Polish was spoken in the Parliament (simultaneous translation into Polish): debate on S4M-03061 in the name of Christine Grahame

5 November 2012

First Parliament Day

23 April 2013

First time Japanese was spoken in the Parliament: Alex Johnstone

13 June 2013

First time the Scottish Government used its power to block a Member's Bill by giving an "indication" in relation to a final proposal – Joe Fitzpatrick, in relation to Neil Findlay's proposed Lobbying Transparency (Scotland) Bill (Standing orders Rule 9.14.13)

25 June 2013

First bill passed allowing the Scottish Parliament to set and collect a proportion of its own revenue: introduced by John Swinney SP Bill 19 Land and Buildings

Transaction Tax (Scotland) Bill [as passed]

12 September 2013

First time a <u>First Minister has been questioned by the Scottish Parliament's</u> <u>Conveners' Group</u> on his Government's legislative programme

12 November 2013

First time that a Scottish Parliament Committee has asked the general public to provide questions that would inform the committee's questioning of the Scottish Government: Health Committee

Questions were answered by Alex Neil, Cabinet Secretary for Health and Wellbeing

5 March 2014

First legislature in the UK to have its own beehive

4 April 2014

First time that a regional seat remained vacant until the following Scottish Parliament election. Margo MacDonald was the fifth regional MSP elected in Lothian in 2011. She died on 4 April 2014. Since she was elected as an Independent MSP, her seat remained vacant from 4 April 2014 until the Scottish Parliament election in 2016.

First Bill designated to follow the procedure for a 'Scottish Law Commission' Bill: Legal Writings (Counterparts and Delivery) (Scotland) Bill

14 June 2014

First time that the Queen's Baton Relay has passed through the Scottish Parliament

30 September 2014

The first <u>Time for Reflection</u> that included a quotation from the Bible delivered in Scots

9 October 2014

First time tax rates were proposed in the Draft Scottish Budget

19 November 2014

First female MSP to be elected to the post of First Minister: Nicola Sturgeon

18 December 2014

First time a Minister took maternity leave

24 February 2015

First Bill under the procedure for a 'Scottish Law Commission' Bill to be passed: Legal Writings (Counterparts and Delivery) (Scotland) Bill

10 December 2015

First attempt to lodge a legislative consent memorandum for a bill where there was no agreement by both the UK and Scottish Governments that the Scottish Parliament's consent was required. The Presiding Officer determined that the Parliament's legislative consent was not required as the UK Trade Union Bill was not a relevant bill under chapter 9B of the Standing Orders

8 February 2016

First time a Scottish Parliament Committee published a <u>report on the renewal of the BBC charter</u>. A <u>Memorandum of Understanding</u> was agreed between the Scottish Government, UK Government, Scottish Parliament and the UK Parliament in June 2015, which gave the Scottish Parliament a formal role in the process of reviewing the BBC charter for the first time

17 May 2016

First time that a Presiding Officer allowed MSPs to use electronic devices in the Debating Chamber to access information online during debates, and to engage in social media discussions on parliamentary issues. <u>Ken Macintosh, Presiding Officer, instructed that the Chamber's WiFi system be switched on while Parliament is sitting.</u>

4 November 2016

First parliament in the world to be awarded <u>triple certification to the Carbon Trust</u>

<u>Standard</u> in recognition of achievements in reducing carbon, waste and water use

15 December 2016

First <u>budget</u> in which the Scottish Government used the income tax powers devolved through the Scotland Act 2016

13 and 20 March 2017

First time that a Holyrood Committee and a Westminster Committee worked together. The Social Security Committee and the Scottish Affairs Committee held two joint meetings to discuss the delivery of the devolution of social security

20 April 2017

First appointment of an Acting Convener for a committee

7 September 2017

First First Minister's Question Time without open or diary questions

21 September 2017

First urgent question: asked by <u>Pauline McNeill about combustible cladding in</u> Glasgow

27 February 2018

First time a Scottish Government Bill has been introduced with provisions that the Presiding Officer has stated to be outwith the legislative competence of the Parliament: UK Withdrawal from the European Union (Legal Continuity) (Scotland) Bill (statements on legislative competence)

12 March 2018

A new <u>legal requirement to register lobbying activity</u> came into effect as the Lobbying (Scotland) Act 2016 came into force

15 May 2018

First time the Scottish Parliament voted overwhelmingly to refuse legislative consent: European Union (Withdrawal) Bill

2 October 2018

First Committee Announcement in the Scottish Parliament

11 October 2018

First UK legislature to host the BBC's political debate programme 'Question Time', broadcasting from the Scottish Parliament Debating Chamber as part of the <u>Festival</u> of Politics

13 December 2018

First time a Scottish Government Bill could not be submitted for Royal Assent in its unamended form. Following a reference under section 33 of the Scotland Act 1998 by the Attorney General and the Advocate General for Scotland, the Supreme Court ruled that some provisions of the UK Withdrawal from the European Union (Legal Continuity) (Scotland) Bill were outwith the legislative competence of the Scottish Parliament

24 January 2019

First debate by the Finance and Constitution Committee to take place on Committees' Pre-budget Scrutiny – an aspect of the new budget scrutiny process based on recommendation 46 of the Budget Process Review Group, which stated that the Parliament should hold an annual debate allowing committees to discuss and debate their scrutiny and the general principles of the budget bill

5 March 2019

First time the Scottish Parliament and the National Assembly for Wales debated the same motion simultaneously: the Scottish Parliament and the Welsh Assembly voted to pass identical motions calling for the planned Brexit date of 29 March 2019 to be put off

6 March 2019

First grouping by the Presiding Officer of portfolio questions on the same subject matter so that these questions could be called consecutively. In this <u>Finance</u>, <u>Economy and Fair Work portfolio</u>, questions 3 and 7 on a no deal Brexit were grouped together.

9 June 2019

First time Norwegian was spoken in the Parliament: Alasdair Allan

6 February 2020

First female Member in Holyrood or Westminster, and the youngest politician at 29, to deliver a Scottish Budget: <u>Kate Forbes</u>

20 February 2020

First time a Bill required a supermajority to be passed, meaning that it required 86 members to vote for it to be passed: <u>Scottish Elections (Franchise and Representation) Bill</u>

5 March 2020

First ethnic minority convener of a committee: <u>Anas Sarwar, Public Audit and Post-legislative Scrutiny Committee</u>

1 April 2020

First additional Deputy Presiding Officer to be elected (for the duration of the public response to the Covid-19 pandemic) by electronic voting and secret ballot, rather than by paper ballot: <u>Lewis Macdonald</u>

9 April 2020

First <u>Party Leaders' Virtual Question Time</u>, which took place due to the Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown

17 April 2020

First Members' Virtual Question Time, which took place due to the Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown. Up to 19 Members had the chance to put questions to four Cabinet Secretaries on the Scottish Government's response to the Covid-19 outbreak

23 April 2020

First virtual committee meeting, which took place due to the Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown: <u>Justice Committee</u>

12 May 2020

First hybrid Meeting of the Parliament, which took place due to the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown

12 May 2020

First Stage 2 virtual committee meeting, which took place due to the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown: COVID-19 Committee

19 May 2020

First time that members of the COVID-19 Committee voted remotely on amendments to the Coronavirus (Scotland) (No.2) Bill using the virtual meeting platform: COVID-19 Committee

21 May 2020

First Members' Hybrid Question Time, which took place due to the Covid-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown.

12 August 2020

First hybrid committee meeting, which took place due to the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown: <u>Education and Skills Committee</u>

30 December 2020

First time the Parliament was recalled during the Christmas recess period. Meetings were held on <u>Wednesday 30 December 2020</u> and <u>Monday 4 January 2021</u> to allow statements from the First Minster on extended restrictions due to Covid-19.

11 January 2021

Michelle Ballantyne became the first Reform UK Party MSP, after resigning from the Scottish Conservative and Unionist Party and sitting as an independent MSP:

21 January 2021

On <u>21 January 2021</u> the digital voting system was used successfully in wholly virtual meetings of the Parliament. It was the first time that members voted entirely virtually from locations throughout Scotland.

27 February 2021

First ethnic minority party leader: Anas Sarwar, Scottish Labour

25 March - 4 May 2021

First time the Scottish Parliament held a <u>campaign recess</u>. Instead of dissolution, from 25 March 2021 the Parliament was in recess until the day before the election. This particular recess is called a "campaign recess". Dissolution happened on 5 May 2021, the day before the election.

6 May 2021

First permanent wheelchair user elected to the Scottish Parliament: Pam Duncan-Glancy

6 May 2021

First female Muslim MSP elected to the Scottish Parliament: Kaukab Stewart

6 May 2021

First female Sikh MSP elected to the Scottish Parliament:

Pam Gosal

6 May 2021

First male Hindu MSP elected to the Scottish Parliament:

Dr Sandesh Gulhane

13 May 2021

First MSP to take the oath/affirmation using BSL: Karen Adam

13 May 2021

First MSP to take the oath/affirmation in Zimbabwean Shona: Maggie Chapman

13 May 2021

First time Punjabi was spoken in the Chamber: Pam Gosal

First MSP to take the oath/affirmation in Orcadian: Neil Gray

13 May 2021

First MSP to take the oath/affirmation in German: Angus Robertson

13 May 2021

First MSP to take the oath/affirmation in Canadian French:

Elena Whitham

13 May 2021

First MSP to take the oath/affirmation in Welsh: Rachael Hamilton

8 June 2021

First motion lodged with Cornish translation: Alasdair Allan MSP

28 August 2021

First time that the Scottish Green Party entered government, as co-leaders Patrick Harvie and Lorna Slater became the Scotland's (and the UK's) first Green ministers. The <u>Co-operation Agreement</u> reached between the SNP and the Scottish Green Party was confirmed on 28 August 2021.

14 September 2021

First SPCB Urgent Question asked in the Chamber: <u>Scottish Parliament (Designated Status)</u> by Gillian Mackay

26 April 2022

The first Time for Reflection that was original and fully delivered in Scots

16 July 2022

First Cabinet Secretary to take maternity leave: Kate Forbes

20 September 2022

First MSP to take the oath pledging allegiance to King Charles III:

Roz McCall

10 January 2023

First MSP to use the proxy voting system, on behalf of Stuart McMillan MSP:

Kaukab Stewart

16 January 2023

First time that the UK Government intervened to block Scottish Parliament legislation (under powers contained in s.35 of the Scotland Act 1998) on the grounds that they

believed it would have a negative impact on UK law: <u>Gender Recognition Reform</u> (<u>Scotland</u>) <u>Bill</u>

28 March 2023

First Scots Asian and Muslim MSP to be elected to the post of First Minister:

Humza Yousaf

30 March 2023

First time that a disruption to parliamentary business from the public galleries resulted in a temporary exclusion from the Chamber, for a period of 6 months, being imposed on protesters: FMQs

6 September 2023

First time that the Presiding Officer/Deputy Presiding Officer reminded MSPs in the Chamber of the new approach in relation to asking parliamentary questions, which should now be put within 45 seconds and answers should be concluded within one minute:

14 September 2023

The Scottish Government lodged a motion to reconsider the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill. This means that the Parliament could start Reconsideration Stage proceedings for the first time:
