*S5M-03182 Brian Whittle: Break the Silence—That the Parliament acknowledges the work of the Kilmarnock-based Break the Silence, which provides survivors of rape and childhood sexual abuse, and their families, with a range of free and confidential support services, including one-toone counselling with professionally-qualified counsellors, couples support, complementary therapies, group activities and volunteering opportunities to assist with personal development; understands that a high number of survivors of such abuse can develop unhealthy coping strategies or experience mental health issues; further understands that, while mental health services often focus on treating symptoms, Break the Silence tailors it support to allow people to work through their trauma, with the aim of breaking them out of negative cycles and supporting them towards a brighter, hopeful future; recognises that it aims to increase awareness of the impact of childhood sexual abuse and rape by working with a number of partners across East and North Ayrshire to provide information and training to improve recognition of and response to signs of it happening; understands that, while recent figures suggest that 21% of girls and 16% of boys experience some form of sexual abuse, many cases are undisclosed and remain unreported: believes that this means the real figure could be higher; considers that the work of Break the Silence and other similar organisations throughout Scotland and the UK plays a vital role in both combating the scourge of this abuse and supporting survivors towards positive outcomes; notes the view that these organisations deserve the greatest possible support from all levels of government; thanks the staff and volunteers of Break the Silence for their tremendous efforts, and wishes the organisation continued success.

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- *S5M-03180 Edward Mountain: Tiny 3D-models Business Launch—That the Parliament welcomes the launch in Inverness of the business, Minimesized, by Mike Mackenzie and Douglas Rodgers, which creates 3" to 9" lifelike models that it calls "shelfies"; notes that these are developed from one-second scans and the models are delivered two weeks later from San Francisco; understands this state-of-the-art technology is among the first of its kind, and wishes the new venture every success.
- *S5M-03179 Edward Mountain: Nessie-hunter Steve Feltham Collects Tourism Award—That the Parliament congratulates Steve Feltham on being named Ambassador of the Year at the Highlands and Islands Tourism Awards; notes that he has spent 25 years searching for the elusive Loch Ness monster, following him giving up his home and position in the family business in Dorset in 1991 to follow his dream, and recognises that, in so doing, he has made a remarkable and lengthy contribution to tourism at Loch Ness.

Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
