*S5M-00311 Liam McArthur: Remembering Charles Kennedy—That the Parliament pays tribute to the late Charles Kennedy on the anniversary of his passing on 1 June 2015; notes that Charles, who served as an MP for 32 years and was the former leader of the Liberal Democrats, was born in Inverness in 1959 and was educated at Lochaber High School in Fort William; understands that he studied politics and philosophy at the University of Glasgow, where he gained prominence by winning the Observer Mace debating competition and where also, in later life, he would serve as rector between 2008 and 2014; notes that he was first elected to the UK Parliament in 1983, aged 23, as the Social Democratic Party (SDP) member for Ross, Cromarty and Skye, which was the only SDP gain; believes that he played a key role in the 1988 merger between the SDP and Liberal Party that led to the formation of the Social and Liberal Democratic Party, which was later renamed the Liberal Democrats; notes that he was subsequently elected as the leader of the party in 1999; believes that he passionately championed the causes of social justice, Scottish home rule and constitutional and electoral reform and notably led the opposition against the Iraq war; notes that, in 2005, he led the Liberal Democrats to the party's most successful post-war general election result; considers Charles a remarkable political figure who, with his combination of eloquent oratory and wit, along with his genuine human touch, inspired generations to engage with politics; pays tribute to the immense contribution that he made to public life, both nationally and across his Highland constituency, and sends its condolences to Charles's family and friends.

***S5M-00310 Jackie Baillie: Restoring Business Confidence**—That the Parliament notes that the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales and Grant Thornton have revently published their quarterly report on business confidence; further notes that the survey found that business confidence levels in Scotland have fallen sharply from +10.4 to -7.0 in the last quarter, taking it to a negative rating, which was last seen a year ago; acknowledges that, while business confidence across the UK has also fallen, the scale of the reduction in Scotland is worse; recognises that the decline in confidence may be attributed in part to the changes in the energy market, the financial services sector, the weakness of domestic demand resulting in slower sales growth and uncertainty over the EU referendum; regrets that the report suggests that this may result in a further increase in unemployment and decrease in employment levels, and therefore

calls on the Scottish Government to increase efforts to restore confidence to business in order to grow the economy.

*S5M-00308 Kenneth Gibson: Time to Ban Microbeads—That the Parliament supports Greenpeace UK's campaign to ban microbeads; understands that these tiny polyethylene plastic beads, which are found in cosmetic products, are used as exfoliants in facial scrubs, body washes and toothpastes and can cause high levels of sea pollution and that, as they do not disintegrate or biodegrade, they have a huge lasting environmental effect; is concerned at reports of increasing amounts of plastic being found in the digestive tracts of both marine life and birds; applauds the governments of Canada and the USA on working to ban the beads in cosmetic products; notes however that the US legislation only covers wash-off products, and calls on the UK Government to learn from this and to work toward reducing the levels of pollution in the oceans by introducing a wide-ranging ban on these beads.
