Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*S5M-02324 Stuart McMillan: Impact of UK Government Welfare Reforms—That the Parliament notes with concern the research conducted for the Parliament's Social Security Committee by Sheffield Hallam University, which shows that, by 2020-21, Scotland can expect to lose just over £1 billion a year as a result of the welfare measures introduced by the UK Government; further notes that the university also estimates that the pre-2015 reforms are already costing claimants in Scotland just over £1.1 billion a year, bringing the cumulative loss expected from all the post-2010 welfare reforms up to more than £2 billion a year; understands that Inverclyde will be the fourth hardest hit local authority in Scotland, with research showing that the loss from the post-2015 welfare reforms expected to average £370 per working age adult; acknowledges that Glasgow will lose the most with £400 a year per working age adult, with losses of £390 a year in West Dunbartonshire, and £380 in North Ayrshire; considers that this should act as a wake-up call to the UK Government as it demonstrates that its approach to welfare reform is not working, and notes calls for the UK Government to immediately alter its ideological approach to welfare reform for the good of people in Scotland.

Scotland—That the Parliament recognises what it sees as the importance of mountain hare conservation and protection; congratulates the charity, OneKind, on its work to raise awareness of the animal welfare impacts of the continued persecution of what is considered this iconic species, but believes that the effects on populations of large-scale culls is poorly understood; understands that such culls continue to take place, including in the Cairngorms National Park; believes that voluntary restraint by land managers cannot be relied on to protect the species' welfare, population numbers or conservation status, and urges the Scottish Government to introduce an immediate and permanent ban on all culls and driven hunts in the country's national parks and to introduce a three-year moratorium on culls nationwide, as recommended by 10 Scottish conservation organisations, including the RSPB and the Scottish Wildlife Trust.

*S5M-02322 Mary Fee: Renfrewshire Council Rehoming Refugees—That the Parliament notes that Renfrewshire Council will soon welcome unaccompanied children from the refugee camp at Calais; understands that the council is among the first in Scotland to work with the Home Office to take children arriving in the UK; congratulates the council for once again leading the way in rehoming refugees in Scotland after it was commended earlier in 2016 for rehoming more Syrian refugees than any other local authority in Scotland; considers that everyone has a moral duty to help individuals who are fleeing from warfare, particularly vulnerable children who are caught up in the humanitarian crisis in Europe; considers that Scotland should celebrate the culture, diversity and skills that refugees bring to the country, all of which enhances the rich fabric of society, and urges the UK Government to redouble its efforts in relation to rehoming Syrian refuges across the whole of the UK.

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
