***[S5M-01910](#) Mark Ruskell: Congratulating Environmental Paper Networks' Cupifesto**—That the Parliament congratulates Environmental Paper Networks for its Cupifesto, which launched on 29 September 2016; understands that the manifesto calls on politicians and business leaders to stop encouraging a throwaway culture by ensuring everyone has the option of drinking tea and coffee from reusable vessels; notes that at least 58 billion throwaway cups are used each year globally, using more than a million tonnes of paper, the production of which requires 32 million trees, 100 billion litres of water and emits as much greenhouse gases as half a million cars; notes with concern that only a small number of these cups are recycled, and wishes Environmental Paper Networks every success in its campaign.

***[S5M-01909](#) Patrick Harvie: Congratulations to Glasgow Primary Schools Community Clean-up**—That the Parliament congratulates the efforts of almost 170 pupils from Anderston Primary, St Patrick's Primary and Glasgow Gaelic School, who took part in a community blitz with help from the Glasgow City Council Environmental Task Force; notes that 95 bags of rubbish were collected as part of a community action day in Anderston, and hopes that the efforts of these P6 and P7 pupils will encourage more people to get involved in looking after their local community as part of the Streets Ahead initiative.

***[S5M-01908](#) Patrick Harvie: Congratulations to The East Ate**—That the Parliament congratulates The East Ate on being awarded a £2,000 Streets Ahead grant to develop its community programme; notes the efforts of the social enterprise to tackle food poverty in Bridgeton in the east end of Glasgow by collaborating with the Glasgow North East Foodbank and local chefs and restaurants; congratulates the group on its most recent "Teatime! pay-what-you-feel" community dinner, which was attended by nearly 60 people and featured produce grown by volunteers at the group's growing space in Daldowie, and further notes that the money will go towards setting up a manufacturing company for locally-produced ginger beer, Scottish cola and rhubarb-ade to enable the group to become self-sustaining.

acknowledges the unique quality that small independent businesses bring to high streets and nightlife, and recognises the efforts of the owner, Craig Tannock, and his team for their outstanding contribution to Glasgow's cultural scene and helping to build Glasgow's reputation as the vegan capital of Britain.

***S5M-01906 Ben Macpherson: LeithLate Attracts Thousands to Leith**—That the Parliament congratulates the LeithLate festival on its success over the last five years, which was highlighted in the report, *LeithLate 16*, which was published on 15 September 2016 ; understands that the 2016 event was the most successful festival to date, comprising of four days of events from 23 to 26 June with over 3,000 people attending a record number of curated events; appreciates that 2016 also saw it launch its first-ever artist commission, with a LeithLate currency designed by Rabiya Choudhry, which included a corresponding exhibition and workshop in conjunction with the youth arts project, #artcore; welcomes the news that this could be the first of a series of LeithLate Limited commissions; notes the feedback from 2016 suggesting that 51% of the audience live in Leith and that 30% visit Leith sometimes, rarely or never; welcomes that the festival therefore attracted almost 1,000 people to the area, and wishes everyone involved with LeithLate all the best for 2017 and beyond.
