*S5M-09429 Christine Grahame: Great Polish Map of Scotland—That the Parliament welcomes the completion of the restoration of the Great Polish Map of Scotland in Eddleston near Peebles, which is the largest three-dimensional map in the world; notes that the map, a 40 by 50 metre, three-dimensional scale model of Scotland complete with surrounding seas and estuaries, was commissioned in the 1970s by the Polish soldier, Jan Tomasik, who arrived in Scotland during the Second World War, and was constructed by a team led by Dr Kasimierz Trafas before being forgotten for several years until MAPA Scotland launched a restoration project in 2010; further notes that the project has involved dozens of volunteers and has been funded by the Consulate General of the Republic of Poland, the European LEADER Fund, the Heritage Lottery Fund, the Polish Foreign Ministry and other organisations, as well as donations from the public; congratulates MAPA Scotland on its success in creating what will prove to be a major landmark in Scotland's cultural offering for tourists and locals alike, and considers that the restoration over many years is testament to the determination and to what can be achieved in preserving Scotland's heritage by dedicated volunteers in Eddleston, across the Borders and Midlothian and elsewhere in Scotland.

Ceremony—That the Parliament congratulates ICAN on winning the 2017 Nobel Peace Prize for its work to draw attention to the catastrophic humanitarian consequences of any use of nuclear weapons and for its ground-breaking efforts to achieve a treaty-based prohibition of such weapons; notes that Setsuko Thurlow, a survivor of the United States' atomic bombing of Hiroshima, will jointly accept this prize along with the ICAN Executive Director, Beatrice Fihn, on 10 December 2017 in Oslo; highlights Thurlow's pivotal role in the UN negotiations earlier this year, which led to the nuclear ban treaty adoption in July 2017, which has the intention of outlawing nuclear weapons; affirms the representation of Scotland at the Nobel Peace Prize award

*S5M-09449 Ivan McKee: Condemning US Recognition of Jerusalem as the Capital of Israel—That the Parliament notes with dismay reports that the United States' President, Donald Trump, has declared that the United States has formally recognised Jerusalem as the capital of Israel, and that the American embassy in Israel will relocate from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem; understands that no other country has an embassy in Jerusalem, and that the international community, including the United States, until now, has not recognised Israel's jurisdiction over, and ownership of, the eastern part of the city; acknowledges Jerusalem's status as an extremely sensitive aspect of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, which it considers will be antagonised by this move; understands that the final status of Jerusalem is to be determined by negotiation, and that East Jerusalem is intended to be the capital of a future Palestinian state but it is currently occupied by Israel; considers that this decision was taken against the advice of a wide range of world leaders and breaks with years of precedent; further considers that the announcement itself may lead to unrest in the Middle East and that the longer-term consequences are unpredictable; condemns in the strongest possible terms what it considers to be a rash, unnecessary and deliberately inflammatory act, and one that it believes destroys the United States' credibility as an honest broker in the Middle East Peace Process, and calls on world leaders to put pressure on the President of the United States to reverse what it considers this ill-advised decision.

Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
