*S5M-09746 Alex Cole-Hamilton: Report by the Jo Cox Commission on Loneliness—That the Parliament believes that loneliness is a hidden epidemic that can negatively impact on people's health and wellbeing; expresses concern that over nine million people in the UK report being always, or often, lonely; understands that the issue does not just affect older people and can be experienced by many other groups in society; welcomes the publication of the report by the Jo Cox Commission on Loneliness, *Combatting loneliness one conversation at a time: A call to action*; believes that individuals, communities and businesses have a role to play in combatting loneliness; acknowledges what it sees as the importance of easy to access, peer-led or codesigned services that can prevent and respond to the problem; believes that the upcoming Scottish Government strategy on loneliness and social isolation offers an opportunity to take a world lead in responding to this hidden epidemic, and hopes that this strategy will be ambitious, cross-departmental and transformative in its aspirations.

*S5M-09745 Alex Cole-Hamilton: Kindred at Risk—That the Parliament recognises the significant contribution that Kindred has made over the past 26 years as a voice for parents of disabled children across the country; understands however that it is under threat as it currently cannot tender for its ASL Helpline in Edinburgh because the service is part of a wider funding "lot" of £1.2 million for ASL services and that the charity is unable to tender for the whole lot; further understands that its staff have warned that, if the situation does not change, it will lose 40% of its income, need to close the office, and make five additional redundancies, having already having had to make two people redundant earlier; commends the projects that it runs in Edinburgh,

Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
