***[S5M-03993](#) Kenneth Gibson: Ayrshire Growth Deal**—That the Parliament notes that the UK Government will deliver its Budget on 8 March 2017; further notes the view that it is imperative that this contains a concrete commitment to the proposed Ayrshire Growth Deal; appreciates that the Scottish Government has already demonstrated its support for the project, which it believes will generate and stimulate real and lasting economic growth to the whole of Ayrshire; believes that the UK Government has displayed an encouraging attitude and expressed its support for the initiative so far; considers that ensuring inclusive growth as part of the deal would reduce inequalities across communities; believes that, with its aerospace, life sciences and manufacturing businesses, and impending coastal regeneration, the Ayrshire economy has a wealth of potential that, with the right investment, can provide that part of the country with the prosperity it deserves, and notes the calls urging the UK Government to join the Scottish Government in what it believes is its commitment to make Ayrshire a priority at last.

***[S5M-04005](#) Brian Whittle: Cardiac Rehabilitation Week**—That the Parliament recognises that 12 to 18 February 2017 is Cardiac Rehabilitation Week, which highlights that rehabilitation after a heart attack is proven to improve health and quality of life, be cost effective, reduce mortality and make savings for the NHS in reducing the number of hospital admissions and the length of hospital stays; notes what it considers the importance of improving access to cardiac rehabilitation in order to support the increasing number of people in Scotland living with heart disease, which is now over 230,000; understands that there were over 68,000 hospital admissions last year for cardiac disease; considers that the benefits of rehabilitation need to be sustained through ongoing community support, and congratulates the Killie Heartmates cardiac exercise support group in Kilmarnock on its 21st anniversary in 2017.

***[S5M-04004](#) Gordon MacDonald: Oxgangs Broadway Convenience Store Fruit Club**—That the Parliament congratulates the Oxgangs Broadway Convenience Store on the recent launch of its Fruit Club at Pentland Primary School, with the aim to make buying a piece of fruit normal and everyday, just as people would buy sweets or crisps; understands that pupils have been issued with a fruit loyalty card that is stamped every time they purchase a piece of fruit; notes that, after four purchases, they get the fifth piece free, and believes that this is a worthy initiative intended to get children to eat more healthily.

***[S5M-04003](#) Douglas Ross: Retirement of Sandy Burgess from Forres Academy**—That the Parliament commends Sandy Burgess on his retirement as the janitor of Forres Academy after almost thirty years in the post on 9 February 2017; believes that Sandy has made a significant contribution to the school and the wider Forres' community; notes that he also served as a special constable with Grampian Police for 29 years, volunteered with the sports club for disabled people and had with many other community roles; wishes him a long and happy retirement in which he will have more time to enjoy with his family, do gardening and play both carpet and lawn bowls, and thanks Sandy for his outstanding service and dedication to the pupils and staff at the school over the years, for which they and the community are most grateful.

***[S5M-04002](#) Clare Haughey: Amnesty International Report Highlights Thai Civil Society in Crisis**—That the Parliament condemns the reported targeting of political activists, human rights defenders and others by Thailand's military government, as highlighted in a report from Amnesty International; understands that Thai authorities often resort to arbitrary detention and criminal proceedings to silence political dissent and government opposition in the country; further understands that, since taking power, the National Council for Peace and Order (NCPO), the ruling military governing body, has "systematically suppressed political opposition by severely restricting the human rights to freedom of expression, association, and peaceful assembly by limiting political activities, curbing public gathering, monitoring private communications, and stifling public discourse on matters of national interest"; considers that NCPO decrees have also permitted soldiers extensive law enforcement powers and have given military courts jurisdiction over various cases involving civilians; understands that more than 100 individuals were charged with criminal offences relating to their peaceful activities during the months prior to the constitutional referendum in August 2016, while dozens of student activists were also arrested for protesting against military rule; believes that some prominent members of Thailand's civil society face charges in multiple cases and could be imprisoned for years or decades if convicted; understands that many of the cases involve a large number of defendants, which it considers demonstrates how these laws are being applied in an expansive and arbitrary manner against anyone that the government perceives as its adversary, and supports Amnesty International's demand that Thailand's military government must "create a safe and enabling environment for human rights defenders and other members of Thailand's civil society to exercise peacefully their rights to freedom of expression, association and assembly without intimidation, harassment, arrest or prosecution."

***S5M-04000 Edward Mountain: Captain David Seath Memorial Fund**—That the Parliament recognises Fiona Chalmers, an ex-soldier from the Black Isle, who is taking part in the Stirling Scottish Marathon to raise funds for the Captain David Memorial Fund in memory of her friend who collapsed and died during the London Marathon while raising funds for Help for Heroes, and notes that the Captain David Seath Memorial Fund raises money to support sick, injured and wounded veterans through Help for Heroes.

***S5M-03999 Alison Johnstone: One Million Days in Temporary Accommodation**—That the Parliament acknowledges the findings of Shelter Scotland's annual report on the use of temporary accommodation in Scotland, which shows that families with children spent a total of almost one million days in temporary accommodation last year, that 13% of families with children were in temporary accommodation for longer than a year and that Scottish Government statistics show a 17% rise in the number of homeless children in temporary accommodation between 2015 and 2016; understands that long periods in temporary accommodation can damage children's mental and physical health and disrupt their education; notes Shelter Scotland's call for a new national homelessness strategy and guidance on standards for temporary accommodation, and supports all efforts to tackle homelessness.

***S5M-03998 Neil Findlay: Scotland and Qatar**—That the Parliament is concerned at the reported deaths of construction workers at World Cup venues and projects in Qatar; believes that over 1,200 workers, most of whom were migrants, have died and that the death toll rises by the week; understands that, despite numerous media articles and the major report by Amnesty International in 2016, *The Ugly Side of the Beautiful Game*, this continues unabated; notes that what it sees as this exploitation of the migrant workers, particularly in the construction sector, has been widely reported by human rights and trades union groups and the international media, and considers therefore that, in light of this, the Scottish Government's so-called investment pitches to the Qatari sovereign wealth fund for its public infrastructure projects and on behalf of private developers for projects such as offshore renewables, marine energy and the transmission network have been wholly inappropriate and not in tune with a commitment to human rights.

***S5M-03997 Andy Wightman: Non-Domestic Rate (Scotland) Order 2017**—That the Local Government and Regeneration Committee recommends that the Non-Domestic Rate (Scotland) Order 2017 (SSI 2017/8) be annulled.

***S5M-03996 Liam Kerr: OPITO Study Shows Confidence in North Sea Future**—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of the study by the oil and gas skills industry organisation, OPITO, which shows that young people living in the UK's key energy hubs still believe that there is a long term future in the North Sea and want to pursue a career in the oil and gas industry, and commends the more than 500 students from Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire for contributing to the report, *The Youth Perception of a Career in the Oil and Gas Industry*.

***S5M-03995 Kate Forbes: West Highland College UHI**—That the Parliament congratulates everyone at the University of the Highlands and Islands' (UHI) West Highland College on it being ranked as one of Scotland's highest performing colleges; notes that its full-time student success rate for further education of 75.9% is 10% higher than the national average; welcomes the fact that eight of the nine UHI colleges performed above the national average, and believes that this affirms that UHI's unique model of learning helps students across the Highlands and Islands to succeed.

***S5M-03994 Pauline McNeill: Millions Starving in Yemen**—That the Parliament notes with concern reports that almost 3.3 million people, including 2.1 million children, are suffering from acute malnutrition in Yemen; understands that the UN has appealed for £1.7 billion to provide vital assistance to 12 million people in war-ravaged Yemen who are at risk of famine; further understands that only 45% of health facilities are still functioning, and agrees with Oxfam that "many governments have weighed their narrow national interests in the Middle East against humanity, and humanity has lost".

***S5M-03988 Christina McKelvie: Amnesty International Report, Human Slaughterhouse**—That the Parliament expresses grave concern at the findings of the Amnesty International Report, *Human Slaughterhouse*, which details mass hangings and what it believes are unprecedented levels of systematic abuse of people in the Saydnaya prison by the Syrian state government; notes what it considers the drastic rise in the Syrian government's horrific treatment of detainees since the civil war in the country; understands that the report states that detainees are being subjected to a "trial", which lasts no longer than three minutes and concludes in a forced "confession" through means of torture before being hanged or given a life sentence; notes that, between 2011 and 2015, there have been an estimated 5,000 to 13,000 executions, with between 10,000 and 20,000 people currently being held captive; commends Amnesty International for its detailed account and publication of *Human Slaughterhouse*, and urges the UK Government to immediately condemn the Assad regime for such perceived atrocities.

***S5M-03987 Margaret Mitchell: Victims of Crime Day**—That the Parliament notes that 22 February is European Victims of Crime Day 2017; understands that, in Scotland, around one-in-seven people each year are victims of crime; recognises the work of Victim Support Scotland (VSS) in supporting people both in communities and in courts who are affected by crime; welcomes and supports the charity's awareness-raising campaign #VSS1mile, in which its staff and volunteers will be rising to the challenge to walk, run, cycle and swim 1,000 miles in February in an attempt to cover the distance between all of its office locations; notes that the campaign aims to ensure that as many people as possible know where to turn if they have been a victim or witness to crime and learn how they can support the charity, and encourages all members to come together to support VSS in this campaign.
