\*<u>S5M-04183</u> Christina McKelvie: Remove the Domestic Abuse Victim Tax—That the Parliament condemns the UK Government's policy to charge victims of domestic abuse for using the Child Maintenance Service; understands that for victims of domestic abuse, the Collect and Pay service is the only safe way for them to exercise their right to child maintenance; notes that using this service incurs a charge of 4% for the collecting parent; believes that the alternative, free scheme, Direct Pay, does not offer the same protections as Collect and Pay and has no powers of enforcement should the paying parent fail to meet their obligation to pay; understands that, in Hamilton, Larkhall and Stonehouse, millions of pounds of child maintenance goes unpaid and leads to children missing out on money intended to support them; further understands that the UK Government exempts victims of domestic abuse from the £20 Collect and Pay application charge, but do not remove the ongoing monthly charges, and notes the calls on the UK Government to remove the 4% collection charge on child maintenance payments for victims of domestic abuse.

\*S5M-04189 Patrick Harvie: Campaign to Save the Old College Bar, Glasgow—That the Parliament welcomes CAMRA's backing of the campaign to save what it understands is Glasgow's oldest pub, the Old College Bar; notes that the building on High Street has been in place since the 1800s with foundations dating as far back as the late 1500s; believes that it is one of the last "working men's pubs" in the area and provides an important community hub for its patrons; understands that plans have been submitted to demolish the building in order to make way for a 12-storey, 426-bed, block of luxury student flats, despite acknowledging the building is in a conservation area in the application; believes that CAMRA is calling for a sympathetic developer to retain and restore the bar in the scope of any new development; notes the long-running campaign to save the built heritage of High Street, which is ones of the city's oldest and most historically-significant streets; is concerned that it is at risk following what it sees as having been decades of neglect and failure to carry out maintenance and repair work, and understands the need to ensure that businesses and students are not priced out of the market or forced into properties that are not fit for purpose.

\*S5M-04188 Kenneth Gibson: Torture and Killings in Syrian Jails—That the Parliament condemns the reported killings by Syrian authorities in jails across the country, as highlighted in the report, Human slaughterhouse: Mass hangings and extermination at Saydnaya prison, Syria, which states that, in just that one prison alone, which is known by detainees as "the slaughterhouse", at least 13,000 people have been killed by the authorities since the start of 2011; recognises that the report found that between 20 and 50 people were hanged every week at Saydnaya between 2011 and 2015; understands that these killings were carried out by the military police and authorised by senior officials, including deputies of President Assad; notes that, since the late 1980s, there have been at least 35 different torture methods recorded in Syria by Amnesty International, with practices having increased since 2011; realises that these figures run up until 2015 only; believes that, in all probability, thousands more people have been tortured and killed since; understands that Saydnaya is not the only Syrian prison to adopt these practices, with Amnesty stating that there are thousands more victims; believes that the victims are overwhelmingly ordinary citizens who oppose the government; understands that sexual assault is also inflicted on prisoners, with a report from the London School of Economics finding that, every morning, female prisoners are taken away to be tortured and raped, and considers that those responsible for these horrific crimes must be held accountable for their actions against humanity.
