*<u>S5M-03729</u> John Mason: Airdrie Savings Bank and Supporting SMEs—That the Parliament understands that the Airdrie Savings Bank is closing down because its relatively small size has led to it finding it difficult to compete with much larger players and that it has been unable to deal with the complex regulations that were introduced in reaction to the failings of larger banks; appreciates the important role that smaller businesses play in the economy and their potential for its future growth; understands that, in March 2016, there were 348,045 small- and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) operating in Scotland, bringing an estimated 1.2 million jobs; believes that SMEs make up 99.3% of all private sector enterprises and that they and other relatively small organisations require particular support in a world of globalisation; thanks the founders, staff, customers and board of Airdrie Savings Bank for their commitment to the organisation over many generations, including to the branch previously in the Shettleston constituency, and welcomes the work of SMEs throughout the country. **R**

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*<u>S5M-03740</u> Rona Mackay: Closure of the Balmore Coach House, the UK's Oldest Fair-trade Shop—That the Parliament acknowledges that the Balmore Coach House in East Dunbartonshire, which it believes is the oldest fair-trade shop in the UK, is to close after 37 years; recognises the work of John and Nena Riches on running the shop and raising more than £1 million for good causes over the years; understands that the couple were inspired to tackle the bridge between rich and poor people after a spell in South Africa in 1975, and notes that, although the business, which opened in May 1980, is closing, it is to be handed over to another fair-trade organisation in the area.

*<u>S5M-03739</u> Alex Cole-Hamilton: Trump Admits Belief in Torture—That the Parliament condemns President Trump's recent comments that he believes that torture works and expresses its disgust at his support of waterboarding; notes that President Obama signed an executive order in 2009 that banned enhanced interrogation techniques such as waterboarding; understands that, in 2015, the US Senate passed a ban on torture; believes that any use of torture is abhorrent and that a country that denies sanctuary to refugees, builds walls to its keep out its neighbours, seeks to curb the media and sanctions torture is unrecognisable to the values held by previous administrations; recognises that the UK has rightly deployed sanctions against countries which use torture; believes that the desire for a new trade deal should not come at the expense of human rights, and calls on the UK Government to use all influence it has to bear on the US in this regard.
