#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S5M-06006 Tavish Scott: Island Games, Support Scotland's Athletes—That the Parliament welcomes the NatWest Island Games taking place in Gotland, Sweden; recognises the contributions and efforts of athletes from the Western Isles, Orkney and Shetland to the Island Games; notes that, in addition to Shetland, Orkney and the Western Isles, 21 further island groups are participating, featuring more than 4,000 athletes across 14 different sports; further notes that athletes from Shetland will be participating in each of the 14 sports; is concerned that the cost of travel for training and competing is often disproportionately higher for Shetland athletes than those from other parts of Scotland, and often prohibitively so; recalls the assurances given by the Scottish Government in September 2016 that it would give consideration to the creation of an islands transport fund for athletes; notes the view that such a fund would further the careers of individuals and teams that are successful in being chosen for Scottish representative sport; believes that this biannual event brings together athletes, families and supporters from across the globe and is a wonderful meeting of friends, bringing out all that is good in sport, and wishes all competitors the best of luck in their pursuit of medals in Gotland.

\*S5M-06014 John Finnie: Amnesty International Calls for UK to Ban Imports from Illegal Israeli Settlements—That the Parliament notes the launch of a new campaign by Amnesty International, which calls on the UK to ban the import of all goods produced in illegal Israeli settlements; understands that this campaign has been launched to mark the 50th anniversary of Israel's occupation of the West Bank, including East Jerusalem and the Gaza Strip; notes the belief that hundreds of millions of pounds' worth of goods produced in Israeli settlements built on occupied Palestinian land are exported internationally each year, despite most countries around the world having officially condemned the settlements as illegal under international law, and calls for an end to the illegal settlements. R
