*S5M-06320 Mairi Evans: Campbell Mearns, Young Game Designer BAFTA Finalist—That the Parliament congratulates Campbell Mearns, who is an S2 pupil at Lathallan School, on being shortlisted for a Young Game Designer BAFTA in the Game Concept Award for Children Aged 10-14 category; notes that Campbell and his family have been invited to the final on 8 July 2017; recognises the hard work of all of the pupils shortlisted and the support that the receive from staff, and wishes Campbell all the best.

*S5M-06319 Gail Ross: Stephen Mackenzie of Ullapool High School, Winner of the Eric Liddell Trophy—That the Parliament congratulates 15-year-old Stephen Mackenzie, who is a pupil at Ullapool High School, on being awarded the Eric Liddell Trophy for best male performance at the Scottish schools athletics championships; notes that Stephen received this prestigious award after breaking the under-17 triple jump record, which had stood since 1996, and that his 13.98m effort led to him being awarded the Bob Stephen Cup for the best performance in that event; wishes him all the best when he represents Scotland's under-17 team at the Schools International Athletic Board Schools' track and field international In Dublin in July 2017, and looks forward to Stephen's career progressing in leaps and bounds.

*S5M-06318 Alex Cole-Hamilton: Royal College of Nursing's Scrap the Cap Campaign—That the Parliament notes the Royal College of Nursing's scrap the cap campaign, which is asking the UK Government to end the 1% cap on nursing pay increases; understands that nursing pay has reduced by between 9% and 14% in real terms since 2011; notes that the Royal College of Nursing is reporting low levels of morale among its members; believes that the 1% cap on nursing pay devalues nursing staff and nursing, leading to challenges with recruitment and retention; further believes that these challenges with pay, recruitment and retention are putting patient care at risk; considers that nursing staff's loss of earnings is severely impacting on their quality of life, and supports the Royal College of Nursing's scrap the cap campaign.

*S5M-06316 Lewis Macdonald: EOWDC Funding for Environmental Research—That the Parliament congratulates four projects that have been awarded grants from the €3 million European Offshore Wind Deployment Centre (EOWDC) fund to research the socio-economic and environmental impacts of offshore windfarms; notes that the projects are an assessment by the River Dee Trust and Marine Scotland Science of how sea salmon and sea trout interact with offshore wind technology, a study by SMRU Consulting and the University of St Andrews into the movement of bottlenose dolphins along the east coast, an investigation by MacArthur Green on the effect offshore wind technology has on the auk population and work by Oxford Brookes University on the impact of offshore wind technology on the human environment; notes that they were chosen by a panel of experts, including representatives of the EOWDC developers, Vattenfall, and the Aberdeen Renewable Energy Group, Marine Scotland Science, Scottish Natural Heritage, SEPA, RSPB Scotland, the Joint Nature Conservation Committee, Whale and Dolphin Conservation and the Crown Estate; understands that half of the funding that the projects will receive will come from the EU; believes that each project will contribute greatly to the understanding of the effect that offshore wind technology has on the environment and the communities, and commends all of the successful projects on their awards.

*S5M-06315 Stuart McMillan: Young Start Funding for Inverclyde Organisations—That the Parliament congratulates two Greenock-based organisations, Enterprise Childcare and the Inverclyde Carers Centre, on being awarded what it considers crucial funding by the Big Lottery Fund through its Young Start programme; notes that Enterprise Childcare has received a £10,504 grant that will support up to 30 8- to 16-year-olds who have autism by providing play and activity clubs for four weeks during the 2017 summer holidays and one week in October; understands that the Inverclyde Carers Centre has been awarded £50,000, which it will use to help support families and carers who look after children and young people, provide information, support and advice to young carers and set up a new young carers' group, which will include a study/homework group and provide online and group peer support, and believes that this money will help both organisations continue their vital work in the Inverclyde community, help young people gain more skills and confidence and give parents peace of mind.
