*S5M-04421 Liz Smith: Water Safety Scotland Response to the UK Drowning Prevention Strategy—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of Water Safety Scotland's response to the UK Drowning Prevention Strategy; notes with regret that Scotland's drowning figures are disproportionately higher those of the rest of the UK and are double the rate per head of population than England; celebrates the continuing success of the Water Safety Scotland's Fife Project in which multiple agencies have come together to educate pupils in water safety and drowning risks, and notes the view that more must be done to prevent accidental deaths due to drowning in Scotland.

*S5M-04435 Gillian Martin: Jenna Morrice, Raising Awareness of Myasthenia Gravis—That the Parliament commends Jenna Morrice, who is from Pitmedden, on raising awareness of myasthenia gravis, which is a rare auto-immune disease that affects eye and facial muscles and is estimated to affect between 14 to 20 people in every 100,000; recognises that there are four support groups in Scotland for people living with the disease, which cover Dumfries and Galloway, Lothian, Strathclyde and Scotland North, and wishes Jenna success in her mission to raise awareness of the condition.

*S5M-04434 Pauline McNeill: One Million Zero-hour Contracts—That the Parliament notes with concern recent figures released by the Resolution Foundation suggesting that nearly one million British workers were on a zero-hours contract at the end of 2016; understands that this represents a 13% increase on the previous year and a four-fold increase since 2000; believes that, because they cannot guarantee work, people on these contracts have no financial stability and will earn less than those in secure work; considers these arrangements to be unsuitable for many, and urges that action should be taken to ensure that they are limited to the workers who might legitimately benefit from them, such as students.

*S5M-04433 Pauline McNeill: The Importance of the Scottish Space Industry—That the Parliament commends the economic contribution made by the space industry; understands that it adds £130 million to the Scottish economy and provides 7,000 jobs; further understands that, over the last two years, Glasgow has built more satellites than any other city in Europe; considers this leading involvement in a developing sector to be a continuation of Glasgow and Scotland's rich scientific and technological heritage, and believes the continued growth of the industry is confirmed by there being up to 36 Glasgow-built satellites that are ready to join the 20 already in space.

*S5M-04432 Stuart McMillan: Ardgowan Distillery, Inverkip—That the Parliament congratulates the Ardgowan Distillery Company on the progress with its plans to build a £12 million world-class malt whisky distillery and visitor attraction in Inverkip, which it hopes to be operational by 2019; understands that it will be sited on the 600-year-old Ardgowan estate, which has a fantastic history that includes links with Pocahontas and Robert the Bruce; believes that, in addition to whisky production, the site will have a gin still, a microbrewery, café and retail facilities and will provide tours; understands that this venture will resurrect the name of the Ardgowan Distillery, which was founded in 1896 and located in Baker Street in Greenock before it was destroyed during the Blitz in 1941; believes that the new distillery will bring jobs and new economic activity, and considers that it will be beginning of a fantastic new chapter in the story of Inverciyde.

Programme—That the Parliament welcomes the commitment from North Lanarkshire Council to invest a further £53 million into its schools renewal programme; recognises the priority given to education in North Lanarkshire by the Labour-controlled council in the face of Scottish Government cuts of £27 million, and welcomes proposals for new schools in Chryston, Gartcosh, Bellshill and Newmains, which will enhance what it considers the learning experience of children and the workplace environment for teachers.

*S5M-04430 Ross Greer: Better Than Zero Fair Pay For All Workers—That the Parliament congratulates the Better than Zero campaign on its joint efforts with 38 Degrees that, it understands, have led to Mooboo Bubble Tea agreeing to pay all of its trainees the minimum wage and to end its practice of 40 hours of unpaid "training" for new staff; believes that this demonstrates the value of workers, particularly young workers, organising collectively through trade unions to defend their rights; considers that the practice whereby businesses attempt to bypass minimum wage laws by requiring periods of unpaid training to be immoral and unacceptable, and calls on all employers in Scotland to ensure that they pay all of their staff fairly, with the real living wage as the minimum.

*S5M-04429 Mark Ruskell: Concerns Over Label Rouge Salmon Certification—That the Parliament recognises the concerns that it understands have been raised by the Global Alliance Against Industrial Aquaculture regarding the environmental and animal welfare standards of Label Rouge Scottish salmon; notes that around 8,000 tonnes of Label Rouge Scottish salmon is produced each year, primarily for the French market but also for sale in Germany, Switzerland and the Far East; believes that, despite claims that Label Rouge Scottish salmon is produced to "very stringent standards", details of these standards and regulations are not publicly available;
