***S5M-04998 Ruth Maguire: Zero Tolerance Report, "Sexism is a waste...": the need to tackle violence and misogyny in Scotland's workplaces**—That the Parliament notes with concern the findings of the Zero Tolerance report, *"Sexism is a waste...": the need to tackle violence and misogyny in Scotland's workplaces*, in which 70% of respondents described experiencing or witnessing sexual harassment, teasing or innuendo, that 73% of respondents were either unsure or unaware of any violence against women (VAW) policy in their workplace, and that nearly a third were unsure that they would be supported if they experienced VAW at work; understands that Zero Tolerance is a Scottish charity working to end men's violence against women by promoting gender equality and by challenging attitudes that normalise violence and abuse, and that its report summarises research undertaken in 2016 into what VAW in the workplace looks like from a Scottish perspective; notes in particular that it gauged the level of support available for those

disclosing violence to their employer and what employers were doing to tackle the sexist attitudes that underlie VAW; understands that the report is based on over 600 responses from women (80%), men (19%) and people who are non-binary (1%) from across the public sector (83%), the private sector (6%) and third sector (9%) and represents the first Scotland-specific research assessing the measures employers are undertaking to prevent and respond to VAW in the workplace; considers that the findings of this report underline the scale of the work that still requires to be done to tackle and overcome VAW and gender inequality in Scottish society; commends Zero Tolerance on its ongoing efforts towards this, and encourages everyone to promote and work towards a society that does not tolerate VAW in any form.

For each Bill, the date of the next (or most recent) event in the Bill's passage is given. Other relevant information, e.g. about lodging amendments, is given in italics.

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
