\*S5M-05469 Margaret Mitchell: HRH the Duke of Edinburgh—That the Parliament pays tribute to the Duke of Edinburgh on his seven decades of service to Queen and country; understands that he will step down from his royal duties in autumn 2017, when he will be 96; notes that, in 2009, he became the longest serving consort in British history; appreciates that he is patron, president or a member of more than 800 organisations; recognises his role in the Duke of Edinburgh's Awards Scheme; notes that, since being introduced in 1956, over four million people have participated in the scheme and that it now involves 144 nations; understands that he has taken part in 22,191 solo engagements, including 637 solo overseas visits, made 5,493 speeches and authored 14 books; thanks His Royal Highness for his services, and wishes him a peaceful and fulfilled retirement.

## **Members' Bills Proposals**

#### **Proposals for Members' Bills**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
