#### Other new and altered motions and amendments

\*S5M-05586 Fulton MacGregor: Deaf Awareness Week—That the Parliament celebrates Deaf Awareness Week, which runs from 15 to 21 May 2017; acknowledges the valuable contributions that deaf people and BSL users make to society in Scotland; recognises that, in the last year, 30 young deaf people in the central belt, including 11 from North Lanarkshire, were supported by the Action on Hearing Loss Scotland service, Moving On, to enter further or higher education, take up training or find employment; welcomes the positive impact that the charity's social security advocacy service has provided; understands that, in just six months, it has enabled three clients in North Lanarkshire and a further 71 across the central belt access to a welfare rights officer in order to claim a total of £53,557 that they were entitled to, and appreciates the inspirational contributions of the many volunteers who support people across the country who are deaf or have hearing problems, including those involved with the charity, Hear to Help, which provides community and home-based support for 6,000 NHS hearing aid users in the Ayrshire and Arran, Perth and Kinross, Dundee, Angus and greater Glasgow areas.

\*S5M-05585 John Mason: Excessive Drinking and Deprivation—That the Parliament notes the findings from a study led by University of Glasgow researchers, which it understands shows a disproportionate increase in ill health from excessive drinking for people living in poverty; notes that the study, Socioeconomic status as an effect modifier of alcohol consumption and harm: analysis of linked cohort data, was published in The Lancet Public Health; acknowledges the comments by the lead author of the study, Dr Vittal Katikireddi, which highlight that the poorest in society are at much greater risk of the harmful impact of alcohol on health, the cause of which is not related to drinking or binge drinking more often; notes with interest the suggestion that the increased impact on health could be a "direct consequence of poor material circumstances and psycho-social stresses", which it believes suggests that poverty can reduce resilience to disease, leading to a greater danger to people from poorer backgrounds; appreciates that the proportion of people binge drinking has fallen in recent years but recognises that 20% of the population in the latest Scottish Health Survey admitted to regular binge drinking; believes that the study is a valuable contribution to understanding the challenges presented by excessive drinking, and hopes that it can help shape policy in a way that protects the most deprived in society.

\*S5M-05584 Alexander Stewart: Steven Cunningham from Clackmannan, Team Scotland Skip—That the Parliament congratulates Steven Cunningham, who is from Clackmannan, on being named as skip for Team Scotland at the inaugural International Curling Challenge Cup for disabled curlers, which was held in Ontario in March 2017 understands that Steven and his teammates, Jim Gales, Jim Thomson and Bob Drysdale, who are all from Fife, were funded by Disabled Curlers Scotland; notes that tournament was played over one week and also included exhibition matches alongside non-disabled curlers, and acknowledges that Steven said that, although Team Scotland wanted to play well at this event, primarily the trip was to promote curling for disabled people.

\*S5M-05583 Mary Fee: International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia and Biphobia—That the Parliament recognises that 17 May 2017 marks the 13th International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia and Biphobia; understands that this worldwide celebration of sexual and gender diversity is celebrated in more than 130 countries, including 37 where same-sex acts are illegal; notes that the awareness day falls on this date each year as it was on 17 May 1990 that the World Health Organization declassified homosexuality as a mental disorder; regrets that, in at least 81 countries, same-sex relationships remain criminalised, with the death penalty being applicable in 10; believes that this means that up to 40% of the world population live in countries were not everyone is free to be open about who they love; considers that there is still much work to be done in Scotland to tackle and ultimately eradicate discrimination against LGBTI people; understands that, in the last year, there with 1,050 incidences of anti-LGBTI hate crime charges being brought, and recognises the vital importance of the Human Rights Act 1998 in protecting the rights for LGBTI people, including through the introduction of an equal age of consent, legal gender recognition for trans people and giving same-sex couples equal tenancy rights.

## **Proposals for Members' Bills**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.

The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
