Redevelopment—That the Parliament acknowledges that the redevelopment of Queen Street station in Glasgow has reportedly received a backlash from taxi drivers due to a lack of taxi rank provision during the period of the works; considers that, instead of stopping outside the Millennium Hotel at George Square allowing passengers the option of quickly joining up their journey, taxis are now forced to constantly circle George Square in an attempt to pick up passengers, and believes that, with record levels of air pollution reportedly being recorded in Glasgow, which is higher than in London and Leeds, the lack of taxi rank provision outside Queen Street station is only contributing to the deterioration of the environment and to the health of people in the city.

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
