\*S5M-08658 Annie Wells: World AIDS Day 2017—That the Parliament notes that the 29th annual World AIDS Day is being marked on 1 December 2017; believes that this offers an important opportunity to remember the estimated 35 million people who have died from AIDS-related illnesses; recognises what it sees as Scotland's role as a leader in HIV policy by ensuring access to new medicines and treatments to contribute to prevention options; further recognises that, in 2017, the country became the first in the UK to offer PrEP on the NHS; acknowledges the efforts to exceed the UNAIDS 90-90-90 goals to help Scotland contribute to the global mission to get to zero new infections; understands that there are over 6,000 people living with HIV in Scotland; notes with concern statistics suggested that two young people in the country are diagnosed with HIV every month; further notes the view that it is important to end HIV-related stigma by using Scotland's HIV Anti-Stigma Strategy to ensure that everyone can access high-quality healthcare and support, and commends the work of HIV Scotland on what it sees as its work in promoting policy changes that are grounded in evidence and for using the experiences of people living with, or at risk of, HIV to help ensure that the voices of communities most stigmatised in society are heard.

#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

#### \*S5M-08659 Jackie Baillie: Gourock-Kilcreggan Ferry Service—That

the Parliament understands that the Gourock–Kilcreggan ferry service has been affected by unprecedented levels of disruption since the contract with the current operator, Clydelink, was renewed by Strathclyde Partnership for Transport (SPT); believes that services have been suspended, often for days at a time, due to technical faults with the vessel or following failed Maritime and Coastguard Agency spot inspections; understands that, on several Motions & Questions Gluasadan agus Ceistean

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occasions, capacity has been reduced to a maximum of 12 passengers due to a lack of appropriately qualified staff; believes that the unreliability has become particularly acute since June 2017, with the ferry being suspended for several days each month, causing severe disruption for travellers and businesses in both the Dumbarton and Greenock and Inverclyde constituencies; understands that SPT has agreed to retender the contract to secure a more reliable operator until responsibility for the route is transferred to Transport Scotland, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to make progress with the transfer. Supported by: Ross Greer\*

\*S5M-08629 Peter Chapman: Holodomor Remembrance Day 2017—That the Parliament notes the day of commemoration and remembrance of the Ukrainian Holodomor, which will take place on 25 November 2017; considers that the Holodomor, literally meaning extermination by hunger, was a deliberate man-made famine designed by Joseph Stalin's Soviet regime to crush Ukrainian nationalism and the Ukrainian peasantry, whom he viewed as a threat; understands that, due to the wall of secrecy imposed by the former Soviet Union, it is difficult to know how many perished during the Holodomor of 1932-33, although recognises that recent research suggests that between three and seven and a half million may have died as a direct result of the Soviet-imposed famine in Ukraine; notes that, during the height of the famine, international offers of aid and support were turned down by the regime, while vital food stores were allowed to rot in warehouses under armed guard; believes the Holodomor to be a deliberate act of genocide that must be fully understood and recognised by current and future generations, and notes the important role that the Holodomor Remembrance Day plays in achieving this aim.

\*<u>S5M-08661</u> Margaret Mitchell: Brighter Bothwell—That the Parliament congratulates Brighter Bothwell on being presented with a silver gilt award in the Small Town category at the 2017 RHS Britain in Bloom national final; understands that the group was one of eight Beautiful Scotland representatives; appreciates that the group was also awarded two discretionary awards, one for Involving Children and Young People and the other for Gardening in a Changing Climate, and recognises the efforts of all of its volunteers who keep Bothwell in bloom while involving young people in the community and using sustainable environmental practices in horticulture.

\*<u>S5M-08660</u> Margaret Mitchell: Low Parks Museum's 50th Anniversary—That the Parliament congratulates Low Parks Museum in Hamilton on celebrating its 50th anniversary on 3 November 2017; understands that it is rated a five-star visitor attraction by VisitScotland; recognises that the museum features permanent and temporary exhibitions featuring items of local historical significance; notes that the museum comprises two historic buildings, the Portland, which was built in 1696 making it the oldest building in Hamilton, and Hamilton Palace Riding School, and wishes the museum well for the next 50 years.

# **Members' Bills Proposals**

#### **Proposals for Members' Bills**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
