# \*S5M-08960 Maurice Golden: Electric Shock Training Collars in Scotland—That

the Parliament understands that a range of experts, including academics, dog behaviourists, trainers and vets, consider the use of electric shock training collars to be both harmful to a dog's wellbeing and ineffective as training aids; believes that regulating use of these devices would do little to help protect dogs from harm and could create unnecessary bureaucracy; notes that Wales has implemented a ban on their sale and use, and notes the calls urging the Scottish Government to acknowledge that only a complete ban will offer dogs in the West Scotland region and across the country maximum protection, and for it to implement such action swiftly.

\*<u>S5M-08986</u> Gordon Lindhurst: Dr Elsie Inglis Statue Campaign—That the Parliament congratulates the *Edinburgh Evening News* and Edinburgh-based charity, One City Trust, on the launch of their fundraising drive for a statue in the city dedicated to Dr Elsie Inglis; understands that, following the recent news that a commemorative plaque is to be placed at Edinburgh Central Library in memory of Dr Inglis and other women who died serving Scottish women's hospitals, the campaign will seek to secure £50,000 towards the statue; notes that the fundraising effort will be launched as Edinburgh marks 100 years since the death of Dr Inglis, who died on 26 November 1917, the day after she returned to the UK from Russia working with a Scottish women's hospital

unit; notes her outstanding achievements, and wishes everyone involved in the fundraising effort every success in reaching its target.

\*<u>S5M-08981</u> Adam Tomkins: World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims—That the Parliament acknowledges the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims, which is commemorated on the third Sunday of November each year; notes with concern that 191 people were killed in road accidents in Scotland in 2016, which was a 14% rise on the previous year, and that there was a 6% increase in the number of people who were seriously injured; further notes that Glasgow experienced the highest number of road accidents of any local authority area in Scotland in 2016, with 1,571 casualties, which included 151 children; pays tribute to the emergency services that act as first responders to road traffic accidents, as well as health professionals who provide vital medical care to victims and who save many lives; recognises that road traffic accidents can have a devastating and enduring impact on the lives of victims, their families and communities long after they have occurred, and believes that one life lost on Scotland's roads is one too many.

# \*<u>S5M-08979</u> Emma Harper: Opening of Kelso High School—That the Parliament welcomes the opening of the new Kelso

# **Members' Bills Proposals**

#### **Proposals for Members' Bills**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
