S5M-07684 Jeremy Balfour: Scottish Disability Sport—That the Parliament acknowledges that Scottish Disability Sport, in conjunction with other home country disability organisations, has developed a UK Disability Inclusion Training (UKDIT) course, which is aimed at those interested in becoming involved in sport for disabled people; understands that the workshop includes a mix of theory and practical delivery to enable participants to positively include disabled people in physical activity and sport; further understands that the workshop tackles issues such as perceptions, knowing the participant, communication, terminology, models of inclusion and practical opportunities to include disabled participants in a variety of settings; believes that the training has led to 94% of participants using the theory of inclusion principles, 84% reporting that the training had impacted on their teaching and 75% sharing their learning from the course with workplace colleagues, and notes that the workshop has been tailored to upskill and increase the confidence of teachers, students and staff in the education sector in the Lothian region and across Scotland who require support and guidance on how to effectively include disabled pupils in the delivery of sport and physical activity, in a way that is aligned to the curriculum for excellence and ensures a smooth transition into community-based sport.

\*S5M-08406 Jenny Gilruth: Teaching Political Education—That the Parliament notes with concern the letter sent by the UK Government minister and Chief Whip of the Conservative Party, Chris Heaton-Harris, in which he requested a list of academics teaching about Brexit in universities across the UK, including the University of St Andrews; notes the view that academic freedom must be rigorously defended by all levels of government and notes what it sees as the importance of teaching about political literacy in Scotland's schools, chiefly through Modern Studies in secondaries and Social Studies in primaries, and considers that a population who are taught about the political structures by which they are governed are far more likely to engage in the democratic process. R

\*S5M-08387 Gordon Lindhurst: Barclay Review Recommendations and the Sport and Leisure Sector—That the Parliament notes the recommendations of the Barclay Review of Non-Domestic Rates 2016/17; recognises that the Cabinet Secretary for Finance and the Constitution responded to the review in September 2017 by announcing that some of the recommendations would be taken up by the Scottish Government and that others merited "further thought and consideration"; notes that these other recommendations include a suggestion to restrict charitable relief for arms-length external organisations (ALEOs), a review of sports club relief and the implementation of rates for commercial and recreational activities in public parks; acknowledges what it understands are the concerns of ALEOs and community sports clubs regarding the collective impact of these recommendations which, it understands, if implemented, could cost millions of pounds for ALEOs, such as Edinburgh Leisure, which provides public recreational facilities often at a fraction of the cost of other sports facilities; highlights what it sees as the important role that ALEOs and community sports clubs play in providing accessible facilities that allow people to pursue healthy and active lifestyles; notes the assertion by ministers that "the Scottish Government's over-arching policy objective [is] to make Scots active for life" and that "we want to get and keep more Scots active"; is concerned therefore that, if the review's recommendations are taken forward, there could be an increase on the amount consumers pay to access facillities or the facilities could be stripped back, which it believe would restrict access and ultimately impacting on the policy objective and the health of the nation; notes the view that it is important to consult directly with stakeholders during the consideration of nondomestic rates, and further notes the calls for the Scottish Government to fully consider the potential effects of implementing these recommendations.

# **Members' Bills Proposals**

### **Proposals for Members' Bills**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
