*<u>S5M-07560</u> Ruth Maguire: Flexible Working, Maximising Talent and Driving Inclusive Growth—That the Parliament welcomes the Timewise report, *Flexible Jobs Index Scotland:*

Maximising talent and driving inclusive growth; understands that the research and report were commissioned by the Scottish Government working in partnership with Family Friendly Working Scotland; further understands that the report represents the first time that the ratio of quality jobs advertised as open to flexible working options in Scotland has been researched; acknowledges the key finding of the report that demand for flexible jobs massively outstrips supply, with only 11.9% of quality jobs, paying at least £20,000 FTE, being advertised as flexible, while 34% of people seeking employment in Scotland are looking for part-time or flexible vacancies; considers that companies in Cunninghame South and across Scotland with family-friendly and flexible working policies reap the benefits of more loyal, motivated and productive staff and a happier and healthier working environment, making flexible working positive not only for workers and families but also for businesses and the economy; believes that the findings of this report demonstrate that companies that do not offer employees flexible working are failing to recruit and retain the best talent, and also highlights the huge potential for growing the flexible jobs market across Scotland; commends the work of Timewise and Family Friendly Working Scotland; notes the calls for employers to read this report and consider what positive actions they can take in the future, and further notes the calls on MSPs to promote family-friendly working practices to local businesses in their area.

*<u>S5M-07542</u> Brian Whittle: The Economic Importance of the A77—That the Parliament recognises the importance of the A77 trunk road, which runs between Glasgow and Portpatrick in Dumfries and Galloway, passes through the East Renfrewshire, East Ayrshire, and South Ayrshire local authority areas and provides what it believes is the main connection between the central belt and Cairnryan, which is one of the UK's busiest ferry terminals, and Prestwick airport; notes that it carries large volumes of daily commuter traffic and is the main route for road hauliers transporting goods, which it believes to be worth in excess of £1 billion to Scotland's economy, between the country and both Northern and the Republic of Ireland; acknowledges what it understands are the

concerns that have been raised by a number of people, including the members of the A77 Action Group, that the road requires significant improvements to improve traffic flow and public safety, and that the current repairs and maintenance programmes are insufficient; believes that the route's faults include a set of temporary traffic lights that were introduced to manage traffic flows over an area of unstable ground, which have been in place for four years and, it understands, regularly generate queues that are more than one mile long; welcomes what it sees as the recent, but long overdue, progress that has been made by the Scottish Government toward the construction of a bypass for Maybole, but notes the reported disappointment of some residents that the design is not a full dual carriageway and does not appear to contain any provision for cyclists; believes that this decision represents a lack of foresight and ambition for the route and notes the view that it should be revisited; considers the A77 to be a critical part of Scotland's road infrastructure, and notes the calls for ministers to consider options for major improvements on the route, including constructing additional dual carriageway sections, rerouting traffic away from builtup areas, providing electric vehicle charging stops and introducing cycle lanes.
