Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*S5M-07590 Richard Lyle: Balfour Declaration Centenary—That the Parliament acknowledges that 2017 marks the centenary of the Balfour Declaration; notes that, on 2 November 1917, the Foreign Secretary, Arthur Balfour, who was a Scot, wrote a letter to Lord Rothschild, in his capacity as a representative of the UK's Jewish people, which was to be passed to the Zionist Federation; understands that this "declaration" promised support for the establishment of a national homeland for the Jewish people in Israel and that this was the first official expression of a historic commitment to a Jewish state and of support for Jewish self-determination; believes that, since the state of Israel came into existence in 1948, as well as sharing values, it has enjoyed an enduring partnership with Scotland and the rest of the UK across many areas, including in trade, technology, medicine and academia; considers that the 100th anniversary of the declaration presents a unique opportunity to strengthen Scotland's ties with Israel, and notes the view that the centenary of this positive legacy of a Scotsman in the creation of the state of Israel should be recognised by the Parliament, and in Uddingston and Bellshill and across the country.

*S5M-07587 Rachael Hamilton: Scotch Whisky Contribution to Scottish Tourism Industry—That the Parliament recognises the contribution that Scotch whisky makes to the Scottish tourism sector; believes that 2016 saw a record number of visits to Scotch whisky distilleries, totalling 1.7 million, meaning that Scotch whisky distilleries, as a tourist attraction, are as popular as the Scottish National Gallery and St Paul's Cathedral; understands that the average visitor spend was £31 per person, £53 million overall in 2016; welcomes the new distillery to Hawick by The Three Stills Company, the first in the Scottish Borders since 1837, where a local visitor centre is planned, and wishes new and old whisky distilleries continued success in the coming year and beyond.
