\*S5M-11956 Alexander Stewart: The Reverend Doctor Ian Masson Fraser—That the Parliament is saddened at the passing of the Reverend Dr Ian Masson Fraser at the age of 100 on 9 April 2018; notes that Reverend Fraser was a retired Church of Scotland minister, social activist, theologist and practical philosopher and believes that he made sure that each of his days were filled with something of substance and significance; acknowledges that his well-attended funeral took place on 20 April in Alva Parish Church, before his internment at Gargunnock Cemetery; notes that Reverend Fraser was also a warden of Scottish Churches House in Dunblane, executive secretary of the World Council of Churches, dean and head of the department of mission at Selly Oak Colleges, research consultant at the Scottish Churches' Council and an informal ambassador for the British Missionary Society and Boards; considers that he was known as one of the outstanding thinkers in the church, a talented hymn-writer and raconteur, the author of at least 25 books, an expert on the Scottish novelist, RB Cunningham Grahame, and, in his younger days, a talented footballer; recognises that, in his 100 years, he visited almost 100 countries, some under dictators and totalitarian regimes, and that he was a relentless opponent of apartheid and repression; notes that he was married to his late wife Margaret, who it understands put her career on hold to sustain him and his work and that they travelled together whenever they could, and sends its condolences and best wishes to his children Anne, Keith and Ian, nine grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.

\*<u>S5M-11950</u> Anas Sarwar: International Recognition for Interfaith Glasgow—That the Parliament congratulates Interfaith Glasgow on receiving the prestigious 2018 bronze medal from King Abdullah II of Jordan in recognition of its activities during World Interfaith Harmony Week; is aware that, in 2010, the UN unanimously established by resolution this awareness week; notes the international recognition that this highly-contested prize represents; is supportive of the charitable efforts of Interfaith Glasgow to promote dialogue, respect and friendship between people of different faiths and beliefs; endorses in particular its Weekend Club initiative, which is a response to the social isolation experienced by many refugees and asylum seekers, and wishes Interfaith Glasgow ongoing success in its important and laudable endeavours.

\*<u>S5M-11949</u> Kenneth Gibson: Ethical Use of Facial Recognition Technology—That the Parliament understands that facial recognition technology is becoming more prevalent in national

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and international policing and security processes; notes that, on 26 April 2018 at Gleneagles, Vivienne Ming, chair of the California-based independent think tank, Socos Lab, presented to the 22nd annual conference of Entrepreneurial Scotland her work with the UN on a facial recognition project that helps identify children in a database containing the faces of one million orphans: appreciates that a pilot of this technology in New Delhi helped identify 2,930 missing children in just four days by scanning the faces of 45,000 children across the city, using artificial intelligence software to compare the images to a database of missing children; believes, however, that there are inescapable risks associated with using facial recognition technology in community policing, especially technology that works in real-time, as potential misidentification of a suspect could result in wrongful arrest; is concerned that Facebook has reportedly begun asking users in Scotland to allow the social media platform to identify them in photos and videos by using software that creates a template of a user's face based on other images they are tagged in; considers that, given the concerns raised by Facebook's recent embroilment with Cambridge Analytica, the storage and tracking of biometric identification data across the billions of photos on the platform could exacerbate serious privacy risks to users, especially vulnerable people, and encourages businesses, security firms and community police forces to be transparent regarding their use of recording equipment and facial recognition software, to help guarantee that data is stored and used in an ethical way.
