<u>\$5M-14820</u> Emma Harper: 30th World AIDS Day—That the Parliament notes that 1 December 2018 will mark the 30th World AIDS Day; recognises that the day offers the opportunity to raise awareness of HIV, to challenge stigma, and to reflect on the progress that has been made in the fight against HIV in Scotland and around the world; understands that, with early diagnosis and effective treatment, it is a manageable long-term health condition; recognises however, that it continues to represent a significant public health concern, affecting some of the most marginalised groups in society and often driven by stigma and discrimination; believes that such stigma has a damaging impact on the physical and mental health and wellbeing of people living with the condition and that it acts as a disincentive to access testing and treatment; considers that this can undermine efforts to reduce new infections; commends the joint work of Waverley Care and Scotland's NHS boards across to promote the "Undetectable=Untransmittable" (U=U) message, which is that a person living with HIV who achieves and maintains an undetectable viral load cannot pass on the virus through sex; recognises that this message has been endorsed by health professionals, charities and campaigners worldwide, including the British HIV Association, and believes that information around U=U, and other HIV prevention options, including pre-exposure prophylaxis, can contribute to an improved understanding of HIV, a reduction in stigma and fewer new infections.

*S5M-15070 Kenneth Gibson: Celebrating the Life of James David Forbes—That the Parliament recognises that 31 December 2018 will be the 150th anniversary of the death of the Scottish physicist, James David Forbes, who is renowned primarily for his work on heat conduction and glaciers; understands that Forbes, born and educated in Edinburgh, was awarded the Rumford Medal in 1838 and the Gold Medal in 1843 by the Royal Society of London in recognition of his groundbreaking work on heat research; notes that, following a series of small earthquakes in the town of Comrie, Perthshire, Forbes joined a special committee of the British Association for the Advancement of Science, the stated purpose of which was to obtain instruments and record shocks in Great Britain; recognises that the most significant instrument resulting from the committee's work was the seismometer designed by Forbes in 1844; is aware that the mathematical description of the behaviour of seismic instruments written by Forbes provided the basis for many more advances in the field of seismology; believes that Forbes should be remembered as a vital contributor to the scientific canon of Scottish history, not only for his research but as Principal of the United College of St Andrews University, and hopes that his legacy is celebrated for years to come.

*S5M-15067 Andy Wightman: The Expression Agenda Report 2017/2018—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of *The Expression Agenda Report 2017/2018* by the international human rights organisation, Article 19; understands that it documents a significant decline in global freedom of expression over the last three years and a continuous decline across the last decade; notes with increasing concern that, in the last year, 326 journalists, 97% of whom were reporting on their own areas, were imprisoned, and that a further 78 journalists and 312 human rights defenders have been killed, including what it believes have been the high-profile murders of Jamal Khashoggi, Daphne Caruana Galizia, Mohammed al-Absi, Miroslava Breach Velducea and Ján Cuciak and his fiancée, Martina Kušnírová; notes also what it considers have been the countless media workers around the world who have died while attempting to hold those in power to account; recognises what it sees as the risks that journalists, communicators and human rights defenders face on a daily basis, including harassment, intimidation and threats, which can be in the form of verbal, sexual, physical or online abuse; understands that there is a complex network of actors acting to supress freedom of expression ranging from governments, organised criminals, business interests and religious fundamentalists; rejects what it sees as the rise of so-called "fake news" by presidents Trump, al-Assad and Maduro, of the United States, Syria and Venezuela respectively, and the Myanmar state counsellor, Suu Kyi; believes that this is connected and interlinked to a decline in freedom of expression and with the proliferation of socalled "strongman" populism in politics; considers that this approach is used by states such as Russia, Turkey and Hungary to silence those who protest, disagree or express themselves in a way that contradicts the people in power, and supports the call by Article 19 to reverse this corrosive trend, and for all to work together to ensure that the meaningful democratic principle of freedom of expression is protected.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
