*<u>S5M-15156</u> Kenneth Gibson: 40 Years Since the Overthrow of the Genocidal Khmer Rouge Regime—That the Parliament recognises that December 2018 marks 40 years since Vietnam, in response to murderous provocation, swept aside the so-called Democratic Kampuchean forces and overthrew the government of Cambodia; considers that the Communist Party of Kampuchea Motions & Questions Gluasadan agus Ceistean Legislation Reachdas Other Eile

(CPK), otherwise known as the Khmer Rouge, took control of Cambodia on 17 April 1975 and created the state of Democratic Kampuchea in 1976; notes that, within two weeks of the Vietnamese army's intervention, the CPK government had fled its capital of Phnom Penh for Thailand; understands that, in the 44 months that the Khmer Rouge ruled Cambodia, it was responsible for one of the worst mass killings of the 20th century, which claimed the lives of as many as two million of its own people, a quarter of the population, in a self-inflicted genocide, as well as the deliberate destruction of its own national culture, intelligentsia, infrastructure and even machinery, as it strove to take Cambodia back to "Year Zero"; acknowledges that Vietnam's intervention led to a brief border war with China, which backed the Khmer Rouge despite its extermination of Cambodia's Chinese minority, along with other minorities; understands that the United States and UK continued to recognise the Khmer Rouge Government long after its crimes were understood, as Vietnam was an ally of the Soviet Union, ignoring the regime's horrific human rights record; believes that Democratic Kampuchea was one of the greatest human tragedies in modern memory, and is aware that a large proportion of the Cambodian people remain affected by the trauma of this period.

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
