[S5M-10145 Willie Rennie: East Neuk First Responders](#)—That the Parliament commends the work of the charity, East Neuk First Responders, which provides care in life-threatening emergencies until an ambulance arrives; recognises the difference that early interventions can make in a medical emergency, such as CPR and defibrillation to the chances of survival from a heart attack and cardiac arrest; understands that East Neuk First Responders also provides first aid training, covers at events, runs a school lifesaver project and works in partnership with community councils to install public access defibrillators; considers that there are potential lifesavers in every community who could assist in the period it takes for the emergency services to arrive; notes the opportunities for partnerships to further utilise the expertise that exists, connecting and alerting volunteers who are qualified to provide critical care when they happen to be in the vicinity of a medical emergency, for example through the GoodSAM system, which can simultaneously dispatch the emergency services and local first aiders; recognises that, particularly in rural areas, the quick response and intervention of community first responders can save lives, and thanks the volunteers and staff at East Neuk First Responders and other initiatives that exist around the country.

***[S5M-10365](#) Christine Grahame: Consultation on a Ban of the Export of Live Animals for Slaughter**—That the Parliament notes the support for a consultation on a ban on the export of live animals from Scotland, including from the Midlothian South, Tweeddale and Lauderdale constituency, for the purposes of slaughter or fattening; understands that, in 2016, approximately 2,400 sheep were sent from Scotland to Germany and France for slaughter, and that approximately 3,000 calves were exported to Spain, according to figures from the Animal and Plant Health Agency; further understands that the calves were first shipped to Northern Ireland, then by road to the Republic of Ireland and onwards on a 20-hour sea journey to France, to finally be driven through France to Spain; agrees with the Cabinet Secretary for the Rural Economy and Connectivity's comments on 6 February 2018 that “most animals should be slaughtered as close to the farm as possible”, and accordingly notes the calls for the Scottish Government to consult on a ban on the export of live animals for slaughter or fattening.

***[S5M-10364](#) Monica Lennon: Incinerators, Public Health and Planning in Scotland**—That the Parliament recognises the important role of the planning system in making decisions about future developments and the use of land in communities; believes that planning decisions should always strive to enhance communities and create high-quality, sustainable places that support the health and wellbeing of current and future generations; understands that planning applications for incineration and energy-from-waste proposals are attracting high levels of opposition from the public and that concerns over public health, traffic, safety and impact on residential amenity are commonly raised as grounds for objection by residents in Lanarkshire, as well as other parts of Scotland; agrees that increasing community engagement in the planning process is important and is concerned that the public does not feel adequately informed or reassured when presented with incineration and energy-from-waste proposals; understands that, at a local and regional level, there is apparent widespread public and political opposition to incineration and energy-from-waste planning applications, leading to concerns that Scottish Planning Policy and the statutory planning process is not affording sufficient protection to communities, and notes the calls, as a matter of public interest, on the Scottish Government to update the Parliament on the latest public health information and research that is available on incineration and energy-from-waste technologies,

 - (e) the Keeper of the Records of Scotland,
 - (f) the Scottish Courts and Tribunals Service,
 - (g) a person specified in regulations made by the Scottish Ministers.
- (3) Where information is supplied to the Scottish Ministers under subsection (1) for use for any purpose, they may use it for any other purposes for which information held by them for that purpose may be used.
 - (4) In subsection (1), references to information held by a person include information held by another person providing services to the person.
 - (5) Information held by the Scottish Ministers for the purpose of a social security function may be supplied by the Scottish Ministers to a person mentioned in subsection (2) for use for the purposes of such function of the person as is specified in regulations made by the Scottish Ministers.
 - (6) Where information is supplied to a person under subsection (5) for use for any purpose, the person may use it for any other purposes for which information held by the person for that purpose may be used.
 - (7) In subsection (5), references to information held by the Scottish Ministers include information held by a person providing services to them.
 - (8) Information supplied under subsection (5) must not be supplied by the recipient of the information to any other person without the authority of the Scottish Ministers.
 - (9) This section does not permit or require the provision of information in breach of a prohibition or restriction on the disclosure of information arising by virtue of an enactment or rule of law.
 - (10) In this section, “social security function” means a function of the Scottish Ministers under or by virtue of this Act.>

Members' Bills Proposals

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
