*S5M-09864 lain Gray: Celebrating Scotland's Wetlands—That the Parliament notes that 2 February 2018 marks World Wetlands Day; celebrates what it sees as the importance of Scotland's wetlands and the unique and productive habitats that these bring for an array of species, such as birds, fish, invertebrates and mammals, while supporting many more, including the short-eared owl, which commonly use them for hunting; recognises the international importance of these sites for biodiversity, with wetlands them being designated under the Ramsar Convention; notes what it considers are the ecological benefits that they offer, such as water filtration and flood control; highlights the potential threats that they face from climate and land use change, and notes calls encouraging the Scottish Government to continue to commit to protecting the country's wetlands.

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*S5M-09881 Kenneth Gibson: Save Our Service, Proposed Closure of Food Train North Ayrshire—That

the Parliament is concerned and deeply disappointed at the decision by North Ayrshire Health and Social Care Partnership to withdraw the full £75,000 annual funding from Food Train North Ayrshire, which is a service that provides weekly deliveries of fresh groceries to some of the most vulnerable older people across communities, many of whom are effectively housebound and experience difficulties doing their weekly food shopping, to help ensure that they can eat, live and age well; understands that this decision will force the service to close on 31 March 2018, affecting the lives of 172 older people, 43% of whom are aged 85 or older, 40 volunteers and two employees, who have yet to find out what, if anything,

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will replace it; believes that if the service users cannot get out and about to buy food, it can only lead to a deterioration in their health, with a stay in either hospital or a move into a care home the alternative, which could cause distress to the individuals concerned and impact on the public purse; understands that this decision was taken without prior consultation with service users or engagement with the employees and volunteers; acknowledges what it sees as how valuable the contact with the food train volunteers is for users of the service, some of whom may have no other human contact from one week to the next; believes that the service has had an entirely positive impact on North Ayrshire's health and social care objectives since it launched in September 2015 by allowing older people to live independently and relieving demand on both hospitals and formal social care; considers that the decision to cease funding is short-sighted and unreasonable, given that, in 2017, Food Train North Ayrshire supported 236 people at home, equating to £317.80 per person, while the 2017-18 rate for a publicly-funded care home place costs £26,869 per year; commends the volunteers and supporters of the food train on the launch of the campaign, Save Our Service, which aims to highlight the positive impact that Food Train North Ayrshire has had on vulnerable older people, and notes the calls on North Ayrshire Health and Social Care Partnership to urgently rethink and reverse its decision. *S5M-09880 Ross Greer: Support for Political Prisoners in Turkey—That the Parliament notes with concern the recent prison sentences that have been imposed on elected representatives and other politicians in Turkey, including the MPs, Aysel Tugluk, who is the vice co-chair of the People's Democratic Party (HDP), Sebahat Tuncel, who is the co-chair of the Democratic Regions Party, and the MPs, Idris Baluken, Nursel Aydogan, Adem Gever and Leyla Birlik; understands that Ms Birlik visited Scotland in June 2016 and that, during this, she highlighted what it understands is the threat of prosecution facing many Kurdish and Turkish opposition politicians; believes that the imprisonment of politicians in Turkey severely undermines democracy and the rule of law, and calls on the Turkish Government to ensure the release of all opposition politicians, journalists and others who have been imprisoned on what it sees as spurious charges.

*<u>S5M-09879</u> **Murdo Fraser: Reduction in Income Inequality—**That the Parliament welcomes figures from the Office for National Statistics (ONS), which suggest that disposable income for the poorest fifth of households is 15% higher than before the recession, equating to an average increase of £1,800; recognises that the corresponding figure for the richest fifth details an increase

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of 0.4%, equivalent to just £200 per annum; notes that Glen Everett, who is an ONS statistician and head of its Wellbeing and Inequalities section said that, "households have more disposable income than at any time previously...overall, income inequality has slowly fallen over the last decade", and believes that these hugely encouraging statistics highlight the stable management of the economy by the UK Government as well as its efforts to narrow income inequality.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
